## FROM OUR PASTOR, FATHER AMATO

I hope that your Lent is going well so far and that you are keeping to your resolutions, disciplines, and mortifications. From my experience of Lent, whatever disciplines I have chosen seem easy for the first couple weeks. Then, around the third or fourth week, it is as if time slows down and Easter is a long way off. That is when we need to be reminded of why we are doing this to begin with, and to stay focused on the road to Easter. If we succeed, it will make the victory of Easter that much better.

Something else that I have been wanting to write about for a while now is what to do when it is difficult to schedule a Mass at the parish. We all have loved ones for which we want to have Masses said for the repose of their soul. We also have a limited number of Masses, with one Sunday Mass always said pro populo (For the People). It is understandable that we want to be in attendance at the Mass where the fruits of the Mass are applied to the soul of our loved ones. This may give us a better sense of our continuing connection with them or bring some other comfort to us and our families.

However, this may not always be possible unless we are willing to wait a while for an opening on the Mass intention schedule. One good thing about the number of Mass intentions we have is that I believe it is a sign of a healthy, faithful, and devout parish. If we had a bunch of open spots with no Mass intentions every week, I would be concerned. So, this is a good problem that we have, even if it may be frustrating for some, at times.

One suggestion is that, instead of ten Masses for ten different people, you could combine names into less Masses. The fruits of the Mass, the effects of the Sacrifice of Christ, are infinite. They are not divided by the number of people for whom the Mass is offered but only differ according to the disposition of the one receiving such benefits.

As I was thinking about writing this article, the very topic I wanted to write about came up on National Catholic Register: <a href="https://www.ncregister.com/blog/7-options-for-mass-offerings">https://www.ncregister.com/blog/7-options-for-mass-offerings</a>. Please check out that article regarding the opportunities to have Masses said for your loved ones. I want to give a few highlights, as the article goes into greater detail for each of the places mentioned where you can have Masses said.

When my grandmother passed away on my first weekend at the parish (July 4, 2021), I received quite a few Mass cards for her from parishioners who enrolled her at various places. For example, I received a Mass card from the Marians of the Immaculate Conception in Stockbridge, MA (on the list in the link above). I also received Mass cards from the Perpetual Mass Association of the Servants of Mary (Servite Order), Society of African Missions (SMA) Fathers, and the Carmelite Monastery in Rochester. Another option not given on the list given in the link above is the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington, DC.

All of these, and more, are great options for us to assist our loved ones on the path to heaven, whether they have died or are still living. In this Body of Christ, we maintain this duty to pray for one another. Thankfully, we are united by a mystical bond, brought about by our baptism into this Body of Christ; a bond not even breakable by death. And we are united to one another at the altar of Christ's Sacrifice, wherever we happen to be.



#### RULES OF FAST AND ABSTINENCE DURING LENT

Traditionally, the Lenten season is a time of penance, prayer, the reception of the sacraments, charity and almsgiving. The following are various Lenten regulations:

Good Friday—along with Ash Wednesday, this is a day of Fast & Abstinence from meat. Everyone between the ages of 18 & 59 inclusive are limited to one full meal on this day.

All Fridays of Lent—Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence from Meat. All those 14 & up are bound to abstain from meat.

Other Weekdays of Lent—There is no obligation to fast. However, voluntary acts of self-denial (like giving up something difficult) are recommended.
