



FROM OUR PASTOR, FATHER AMATO

After such a long stretch of wearing green vestments every Sunday, I was excited to switch it up with the violet vestments, then white and gold, for these past several weeks for the glorious feast days we just celebrated. Yet, here we are, back in Ordinary Time with the green vestments until Lent begins towards the end of February.

I am sure I have written about this previously, but I think the former structuring of the liturgical year can better help us understand what we are about this time of year. In the previous calendar, it would not currently be Ordinary Time, but "Time after Epiphany." This Sunday would be the "Second Sunday after Epiphany" and this would take us to the season of Septuagesima, which was a "pre-Lent" preparatory season.

Further, after the Easter Season, there is Pentecost. At that time, Pentecost also had its own octave (eight day celebration of that feast day) following the Easter Octave and the seven weeks of Easter. This made for eight weeks of Easter celebrations (an octave of octaves). Following the Pentecost Octave, we had the long period leading up to Advent simply called "Time after Pentecost." This is significant because the longest season of the year is referenced by the moment that God formed His Church by sending the Holy Spirit upon us, this Spirit who is the very soul of this Living Body.

So now we enter "Time after Epiphany," another season where God manifested His glory to the world. It is certainly fitting that we have time arranged in such a way. At this time of year, the calendar gives us time to reflect upon Christ's manifestation (epiphany = manifestation) and we can see the wisdom of ordering time by reference both to Christ's revelation of Himself as God, and by His continual presence among us (and within us) by the sending of the Holy Spirit.

Traditionally, three moments in the life of Christ were connected at this time of year: Epiphany (January 6); the Baptism of the Lord (January 13, the octave day of the Epiphany); and the miracle at the Wedding at Cana (Second Sunday after Epiphany). What is the significance of these three events occurring together? All of them reveal to the world, and to each of us, the reality of the Person of Jesus Christ as God. Interestingly, there were some rites in the Western Church that included the Gospel with the Multiplication of the Loaves on this Sunday after Epiphany, instead of the Wedding at Cana. Now, we only read the Wedding at Cana in Year C (it is currently Year A) of the Sunday Lectionary, for this Second Sunday.

Whatever the Gospel happens to be, we see in the words given to us the manifestation of Christ, the definitive revelation of God to man. Everything He says and does reveals something to us of the glory, love, and mercy of our God who comes to unite us to Himself. In these weeks after Epiphany, as we make our approach to the Lenten Season, let us bask in this glory of the Light of Christ. This light, first radiated from the manger in Bethlehem, still illumines the world, and each of our hearts and souls, down to this very day. May the joy of the Epiphany of the Lord continue to reign throughout our lives.
