FROM OUR PASTOR, FATHER AMATO

I wanted to give you all an update on the past month of conversations regarding possible Mass time changes and my conclusions on this important matter for our parish. First, and most important for your information, is that there will be no change in the Mass schedule at this time. If you were nervous about impending changes, you can rest easy now.

After many conversations, with individuals and with groups, I was edified to hear people trying to see the larger picture of our parish beyond the view from their own usual pew. We also saw how complicated things can get once you start thinking about it. This is why it is important to have principles in mind that serve as a foundation for moving forward with any decisions. It was also good to hear a good number of people who were simply concerned for me as they can see how difficult it is to say three consecutive Masses at three different churches. One of my main concerns is to continue to build our Faith Formation program and to attract more families. At the same time, I want to continue to honor those who have supported our churches for so many years. Balancing all of these concerns means that some sacrifices would have to be made for the greater good in the long run.

I will give to you my conclusion as to which schedule would work best, having considered every angle on this issue, and give my explanation for each one. Again, we are not going to implement this now, but it is worth showing you my thoughts on this.

Part of my goal was not to upset the Mass schedule too much while still reducing the Sunday schedule to two Masses, and still only have at most an hour difference in Mass time change. The first time I settled on for Sunday was 11:00am at St. Dominic. This would allow Faith Formation to start at 9:30am or 9:45 (a reasonable time to start), while Mass would end at noon. This would mean that families would have their mornings at church and their afternoons at home with their families, rather than the current situation of time at the church going into the early afternoon. We have a good number of families that drive here from outside the parish and the current timing of things makes it difficult for them.

Since I wanted each church to have one weekend Mass, we are left with St. Francis and St. Felix. St. Francis would have had the earlier Sunday Mass, at 9:00am, because it would be too far to have the 4:00pm Mass there. A 9:00am and 11:00am at St. Francis and St. Dominic, respectively, would allow a Sunday Mass at each end of the parish with times that are easily accessible for everyone. Even on Sundays that do not have Faith Formation, 9:00am at St. Francis is accessible for families too. One problem with this time, however, is that it may not be early enough for people who want an earlier Mass. I was willing to look into offering a 7:30am Mass at St. Felix as well if that were the case, but it would be without music or additional ceremony (like a Mass during the week). I was also going to forego the use of incense at this Mass to accommodate those who are sensitive to it.

This would leave St. Felix with a 4:00pm Saturday vigil Mass. This makes sense as it is in the center of the parish and easily accessible to anyone in the area, or outside our parish, who would want a Mass at 4:00pm. On Sundays at St. Felix, people park on an angle to the curb directly in front of the church, instead of parallel to the curb. This creates many more spaces for people who need to be closer to the door. It gets you closer to the door than one would be at St. Dominic. The only problem I saw with this is the lack of air conditioning at St. Felix, for the few months we may need it. This does not bother me personally, but I am sure it would bother some people.

These Mass times would allow for only an hour time shift (or no shift in the case of the Saturday Mass) in people's routines, and/or a drive of a mere 4.5 miles (7 minutes or so) down the road. That seems fair. It would also mean that people who may be attached to a particular church would still have a Mass of Obligation at that church, or at least a similar time that one can go to Mass nearby. Finally, each church would have a prominent role to play in our weekend schedule.

I believe this is a good plan that may ultimately allow for some growth given the more convenient Mass times for families. We are just not ready to implement this. I shared all this with you because it is important that you know what I think and that you feel free to share your ideas as well. Even though we are not implementing this now, I am grateful that I had so many conversations with people throughout the parish who helped me think through this, and that I heard what they were saying, and they heard my own concerns as well. Many people I only get to talk to for a brief moment after Mass, and so to sit down and have a conversation about these important matters was well worth it. I am grateful for all who took the time to express their ideas and to offer their prayers for my wisdom and discernment. One of my overarching goals, as I stated a month ago, was to strengthen each of our churches and those who gather there for Mass. We must continue the work of evangelization in our community. We all know people who should be here with us who are not. Continue to extend that invitation and tell them about Christ's mercy, love, forgiveness, and peace that only He can give.
