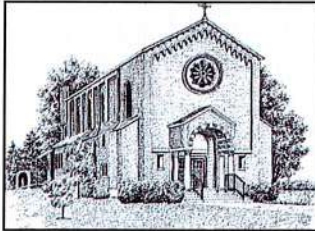

FROM OUR PASTOR, FATHER AMATO

Before I speak about Holy Week, I wanted to correct something I said about the CMA last week. I had thought that last year's goal was about \$54,000 and that our current goal of \$58,000 was an increase of only about 7.4%. As it turns out, last year's goal was actually just under \$50,000. Therefore, the goal increased by about 16 percent. That is quite a jump. I wanted to correct the numbers on that for you and make sure we are all on the same page. As I stated last week, we still owe the money as a parish if we do not reach our goal (something for which we do not budget). I increased my own gift by 20% to help with this increased goal, and I would not ask you to do something I was not willing to do. I am very grateful to you for so many generous donations already on behalf of our parish. It is humbling and encouraging to see so many continue to support our parish and our diocese.

We have now entered Holy Week and the most important events in the history of the world are about to take place. Our Lord invites us to contemplate these Mysteries; the eternal God goes to die for love of His people, and we have life because of Him.

We are blessed that God's Providence has arranged things such that Good Friday falls on the First Friday of the month, April 7. The devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus that we give especially on the first Friday of the month so beautifully coincides with the day on which Our Lord's Heart was pierced and poured out Blood and water from His side. It is from that side, the wellspring of the Church's sacraments, that His Most Precious Blood flows out onto the world, allowing us to enter into His own Body, and so become one with Him. This is the Heart that loves us with an incomprehensible Love. Let us adore the wood of the Cross!

As you know, there is no Mass on Good Friday, but we receive Holy Communion from the Mass on Holy Thursday. On the day the Church commemorates our Lord's Passion and Death we do not repeat His Sacrifice. And so, on Holy Thursday, at the conclusion of the Mass, we will have a procession through the church with the Blessed Sacrament and bring Him to the Altar of Repose, appropriately under the (veiled) statue of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. It is there that we wait, in prayer, with our Redeemer. Just as He went out to the Garden of Gethsemane to be with His Father and He asked the Apostles to keep watch and pray, so too we keep watch as we await the Passion of Our Lord.

Dom Prosper Guéranger sets the scene for us: "In every church is prepared a richly ornamented side-chapel or pavilion, where, after today's Mass, the Church places the Body of the Divine Lord. Though veiled from their view, the faithful will visit Him in this His holy resting place, pay Him their most humble adorations, and present Him their most fervent supplications.... In every part of the Catholic world, a concert of prayer, more loving and earnest than at any other period of the year, will be offered to our Jesus, in reparation for the outrages He underwent during these very hours.... Around this anticipated tomb will be united both His long-trying and fervent servants, and those who are newly converted, or are preparing for their reconciliation."

I invite you, as much as you are able, to come to the Holy Week liturgies, as they are the most unique and beautiful liturgies of the entire year, most especially the Easter Vigil. Spend some time in adoration of Our Lord after the Holy Thursday Mass and sometime during the day on Good Friday. There is a unique silence and starkness to the evening of Holy Thursday through the day of Holy Saturday. We are allowed to enter deeply into the mysteries we celebrate. Enjoy this beautiful time of year in contemplation of what Our Lord has done for us. I greatly look forward to celebrating these liturgies with you as today, Palm Sunday, we proclaim Christ as Messiah and King: *Hosanna to the Son of David!*

RULES OF FAST AND ABSTINENCE DURING LENT

Traditionally, the Lenten season is a time of penance, prayer, the reception of the sacraments, charity and almsgiving. The following are various Lenten regulations:

Good Friday—along with Ash Wednesday, this is a day of Fast & Abstinence from meat. Everyone between the ages of 18 & 59 inclusive are limited to one full meal on this day.

All Fridays of Lent—Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence from Meat. All those 14 & up are bound to abstain from meat.

Other Weekdays of Lent—There is no obligation to fast. However, voluntary acts of self-denial (like giving up something difficult) are recommended.

It's that time of year, when we need everyone to help clean up our cemeteries to get them ready for their first mowings!

Please remove any wreaths or other seasonal decorations you may have left over the winter months and take them home to dispose of them.
