

FROM OUR PASTOR, FATHER AMATO

It does not seem possible that we are already back to September, with all the preparations for the upcoming school year underway. I always associate September with the beginning of school, but we also have two great feast days in this month, while next month is the month of the Holy Rosary.

The two feast days are the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary (September 8) and the Seven Sorrows of the Blessed Virgin Mary (or, Our Lady of Sorrows, September 15). Anything we say about Mary immediately relates to what we believe about her Son, Jesus Christ, and so it is important to speak of her often. There are only three births that we celebrate throughout the liturgical year: Jesus (December 25), St. John the Baptist (June 24), and Mary.

We celebrate the Nativity of Mary on September 8, nine months after December 8, the Immaculate Conception of Mary. That makes sense. We share this feast day with the Eastern Churches as well as this feast goes back at least to the fifth century and then gradually spread throughout the Christian world. With this feast, we recognize the end of the age of expectation and beginning of the realization of God's promises of redemption that He has made throughout the ages. An entirely new thing happened in Mary at the moment of her conception and so now she sees the light of this world with her own eyes, as she was made to bear the True Light of the World within herself.

Her parents, Sts. Joachim and Anne, had been infertile, but long awaited a child. Like Sarah (Genesis 21) and Elizabeth (Luke 1), St. Anne was sterile until a special favor from God gave her a very special child with a profound destiny.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church, #489, teaches us: "Throughout the Old Covenant the mission of many holy women prepared for that of Mary. At the very beginning there was Eve; despite her disobedience, she receives the promise of a posterity that will be victorious over the evil one, as well as the promise that she will be the mother of all the living. By virtue of this promise, Sarah conceives a son in spite of her old age. Against all human expectation God chooses those who were considered powerless and weak to show forth his faithfulness to his promises: Hannah, the mother of Samuel; Deborah; Ruth; Judith and Esther; and many other women. Mary 'stands out among the poor and humble of the Lord, who confidently hope for and receive salvation from him. After a long period of waiting the times are fulfilled in her, the exalted Daughter of Sion, and the new plan of salvation is established' [Lumen Gentium, 55]."



With this feast day, the dawn of salvation is upon us. All that God had promised is coming to fulfillment! This is the joy of the cycle of the liturgical year. We re-live the events of our salvation, not merely as events of the past, but as ever-new, as drawing us deeper into their mysteries. Here in the very flesh of Mary we see the purity of God given to the one who is "full of grace." St. Augustine tells us: "She is the flower of the field from whom bloomed the precious lily of the valley [Song of Songs 2:1]. Through her birth the nature inherited from our first parents is changed." In her, in view of the merits of Christ's Passion, Death, and Resurrection, death is already conquered. In her, as Christ came into this world through her, we have "our life, our sweetness, and our hope."

I will leave you with the eloquent words of Dom Prosper Guéranger, O.S.B.:

"Truly a better paradise than the first is given us at this hour. Eden, fear no more that man will endeavor to enter thee; thy Cherubim may leave the gates and return to heaven. What are thy beautiful fruits to us, since we cannot touch them without dying? Death is now for those who will not eat of the fruit so soon to appear amid the flowers of the virgin earth to which our God has led us."


