




FROM OUR PASTOR, FATHER AMATO

As we continue through some of the main points of *Searching for and Maintaining Peace*, this week we can look at the concept of confidence in God, a childlike trust in our heavenly Father.

One of the points that has stuck with me – and was happy to rediscover as I went through this book again – is the concept of life, and our Christian formation, being a process of re-education in loving and trusting God. Why do we need to be re-educated? Because original sin put into our hearts a distrust between people, and more importantly, between man and God. History, since the Fall of Adam and Eve, has been God seeking His people to bring us back to Himself and show us His love.

Notice what the serpent in the Garden says to Eve (Genesis 3:1): "Did God really say, 'You shall not eat from any of the trees in the garden'?" The first thing the devil does is get us to doubt our Father and the truth of His words. Then he gets us to outright deny His words (Genesis 3:4): "You certainly will not die! God knows well that when you eat of it your eyes will be opened and you will be like gods, who know good and evil." And, as we say, the rest is history. We have been distrusting our Father ever since that time.

It is in Christ that we see the face of the Father and His love for us. He not only exemplifies a loving trust of the Father, but it is by seeing Him that we can see our Father: "Have I been with you for so long a time and you still do not know me, Philip? Whoever has seen me has seen the Father" (John 14:9). Since we cannot see the Father directly, we may, at times, seek security not by giving ourselves, but by withholding...giving a little bit, but keeping parts for ourselves "just in case." Fr. Philippe gives a helpful analogy:

"We cannot experience this support from God unless we leave Him the necessary space in which He can express Himself....As long as a person who must jump with a parachute does not jump out into the void, he cannot feel that the cords of the parachute will support him, because the parachute has not yet had the chance to open. One must first jump and it is only later that one feels carried" (p. 28).

St. John of the Cross tells us: "God gives in the measure that we expect of Him." And further, St. Francis de Sales: "The measure of Divine Providence acting on us is the degree of confidence that we have in it."

And so, how is this trust restored? Assuming that there are many of our external circumstances that cannot be changed, and that we have many problems and concerns that remain with us, the only answer is to change our perspective, to change our heart. To put it more precisely, we must let God change our hearts. This is why Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is so important. If seeing Jesus is to see the Father, and the Host is Jesus, then in Eucharistic Adoration we have the very love of the Father directly before us. It is there that we become like children again, quietly and patiently waiting on every word of our Father. It is there that we have the security and love of our Heavenly Father, where our fears can be cast into the burning furnace of His Heart.

THE SEASON OF LENT HAS BEGUN

Traditionally, the Lenten season is a time of penance, prayer, the reception of the sacraments, charity and almsgiving. The following are various Lenten regulations:

Good Friday-along with Ash Wednesday, this is a day of fast & abstinence from meat. Everyone between the ages of 18 & 59 inclusive are limited to one full meal on this day.

All Fridays of Lent—Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence from meat. All those 14 & up are bound to abstain from meat.

Other Weekdays of Lent—There is no obligation to fast. However, voluntary acts of self-denial are recommended (like giving up something difficult.)




