



### FROM OUR PASTOR, FATHER AMATO

We now enter what is, for me, one of the most profound times of the liturgical year. There is something natural about turning our minds towards "the end" as the days get shorter and darker. We realize our time is short, our own life will come to an end, and in fact the entire universe will be destroyed, and then renewed.

We have a role to play in all of this. First, we have to respond to God's grace to know and love Him. Second, we realize that this life is not all about each of us individually. As part of this Body of Christ, we bear a responsibility for each other. This is the basis of the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy.

At this time of year, the liturgical readings turn towards the end of time and the end of each of our own individual lives. As I have been writing these past couple weeks here in the bulletin, I wanted to give you, first, the doctrine of sin, forgiveness, and indulgences, and second, specific ways to gain such indulgences.

One of the great gifts of the Church is the plenary indulgence that can be gained for the dead, each day from November 1-8. Generally, a plenary indulgence – total remission of temporal punishments due to sin – is gained in this way:

- (1) Go to confession 20 days before or after the indulgenced work
- (2) Receive Holy Communion on the day you perform the indulgenced work
- (3) Do the particular indulgenced work
- (4) Pray for the intentions of the Pope (one Our Father, one Hail Mary, and on Glory Be)
- (5) Be free from all attachment to sin, even venial sin

Only one plenary indulgence can be gained per day. As for the All Souls' plenary indulgence, there are two different ones. Keeping in mind the general requirements above, these are the particular indulgenced works that are applied to the souls in Purgatory:

#### All Souls Day:

- "A plenary indulgence, applicable only to the souls in purgatory, may be obtained by those who, on All Souls Day, piously visit a church.... It may be acquired either on the day designated as All Souls Day or, with the consent of the bishop, on the preceding or following Sunday or the feast of All Saints. On visiting the church or oratory it is required that one *Our Father* and the *Creed* be recited."

#### November 1-8:

- Visit any cemetery: "Only applicable to the souls in Purgatory when one devoutly visits and prays for the departed. A plenary indulgence is bestowed for this work each day between November 1 and November 8."
- Praying for the departed in the cemetery would be a simple prayer such as: "Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord. And let perpetual light shine upon then."

There are other plenary indulgences that can be gained outside of the first week of November. For example, a plenary indulgence is attached to these other works (with all the other general conditions met):

- A half hour of Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament
- Praying the Rosary in common with others
- Devout reading or listening to the Sacred Scriptures for at least a half an hour
- The pious exercise of the Way of the Cross

Each of these can be done any day of the year to earn a plenary indulgence. This is partly why it is so important to have our churches open and available to the faithful.

Besides plenary indulgences, we can earn at least a partial indulgence for nearly anything done in faith and trust in God. I would highly recommend obtaining a copy of the *Manual of Indulgences* which gives all of this information very clearly. The Church grants several general "concessions" that are good for *partial* indulgences:

- 1. "A partial indulgence is granted to the Christian faithful who, while carrying out their duties and enduring hardships of life, raise their minds in humble trust to God and make, at least mentally, some pious invocation."
- 2. "A partial indulgence is granted to the faithful who, led by the spirit of faith, give compassionately of themselves or of their goods to serve their brothers in need."
- 3. "A partial indulgence is granted to the Christian faithful who, in the spirit of penance, voluntarily abstain from something that is licit and pleasing to them."
- 4. "A partial indulgence is granted to the Christian faithful who, in particular circumstances of life, voluntarily give explicit witness to their faith before others."

As you can see, this covers all of our circumstances in life. Everything we do can be offered for the glory of God and the sanctification of souls. This makes sense given God's loving Providence over our lives. Every moment that He gives us is an opportunity to grow in some virtue, to know Him, and to love Him more, as well as to love our neighbor through charitable works and prayer.






#### **BLOOD DRIVE IMPACT**






