

FROM OUR PASTOR, FATHER AMATO

An important aspect of our spiritual life, and one that I find more important as time goes on and as my experience grows, is the value of patience. There are many facets to patience. We may first think of the fact that we all need more patience with those who may annoy us, trouble us, or bother us in some way. We lose patience and react poorly when someone does not do what we want or change at the rate that we expect (usually immediately). However, we also lack patience with ourselves. We can get frustrated at our persistent faults or tendencies that seem to endure despite our best efforts, and even frequent confession.

Even with the good things we desire, such as our sanctification, there must be a certain moderation. Often, we know what we want, and we want it now. We expect that because we want something good, such as some virtue, that God will infuse this virtue into us and we do not have to struggle anymore. When we do not progress at the rate that we think we should be progressing, we lose the peace in our soul, and we are disturbed. St. Francis de Sales says that "nothing retards progress in a virtue so much as wanting to acquire it with too much haste!" (Searching for and Maintaining Peace, 54). As long as we are taking the steps necessary to acquire this particular virtue, avoiding contrary vices/actions, and placing our trust in the merciful Lord who we know wants us to be holy, then we should be at peace. Of course, mortal sin should be confessed as soon as reasonably possible, but even then our attitude should be a peaceful surrender to our God who desires us to be saved.

Consider this from Fr. Jacques Philippe, after telling us that, when we commit some fault or sin, and we feel that anguish of soul, we must do all we can to remain at peace:

"In the daily experience of our miseries and faults, this is the fundamental principle that must guide us. It is not so much a question of our making superhuman efforts to completely eliminate our imperfections and our sins (that which is, in any case, beyond our reach!), as it is a question of knowing how, as quickly as possible, to recapture our peace when we have fallen into sin or have been troubled by the experience of our imperfections, and to avoid sadness and discouragement" (p. 57).

Far from being an allowance for laxity or mediocrity, it is a call to sanctity. The first reason for this is because God acts in the peace of one's soul, not in the turbulence and anguish. It is only God who can liberate us from our faults, and the sooner we relent of our self-reliance and let God act in us, the sooner we are at peace. Second, it is pleasing to God when we realize that all we can do on our own is sin, and then we are able to turn to Him in humility and confidence, seeking His pardon and peace.

The third reason may seem counter-intuitive, but my experience has shown it to be true:

"...the trouble, sadness and the discouragement that we feel regarding our failures and our faults are rarely pure; they are not very often the simple pain of having offended God. They are in good part mixed with pride. We are not sad or discouraged so much because God was offended, but because the ideal image that we have of ourselves has been brutally shaken. Our pain is very often that of wounded pride" (p. 58; emphasis added).

The first time I read that, it hit me hard. It takes some work to examine our inner motives, but it is well worth the effort. In prayer, it is important to be honest with ourselves and God in that intimate conversation of the heart.

THE SEASON OF LENT HAS BEGUN

Traditionally, the Lenten season is a time of penance, prayer, the reception of the sacraments, charity and almsgiving. The following are various Lenten regulations:

Good Friday—along with Ash Wednesday, this is a day of <u>fast & abstinence from meat</u>. Everyone between the ages of 18 & 59 inclusive are limited to one full meal on this day.

All Fridays of Lent—Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence from meat. All those 14 & up are bound to abstain from meat.

Other Weekdays of Lent—There is no obligation to fast. However, voluntary acts of self-denial are recommended (like giving up something difficult.)




