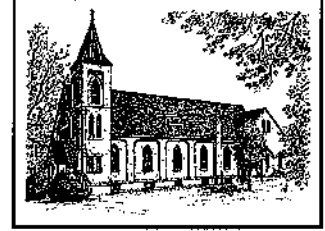

FROM OUR PASTOR, FATHER AMATO

The week of Monday, April 17, was eventful for a couple reasons. First, it was officially announced that I am now the Pastor of our parish here. This gives all of us a sense of stability as there is an actual term that goes with the appointment; a term which concludes in June 2027, but is also renewable. I suppose the point is that whoever our next bishop is, he will decide what to do next. For now, I am very grateful for this assignment and for all of you who have been so good to me these nearly two years. Of course, I am also grateful for the bishop's confidence in me in appointing me as Pastor and allowing me to continue my priestly ministry here at St. Peter's Parish.

A second event that week was the annual Priest Convocation. Every year, the priests of our diocese gather somewhere within the diocese, with our bishop, for fellowship and continued formation. The bishop gives us all an address, but we also invite in a guest speaker to give three or four talks on a particular topic. This year, we met in Auburn, and we were very blessed to have Fr. Jonathan Kalisch, OP, join us for a series of talks on the priesthood.

Fr. Kalisch is the Director of Chaplains and Spiritual Development for the Knights of Columbus. He spent ten weeks in Poland serving Ukrainian refugees fleeing from the war in their own country, as part of his great work with the Knights of Columbus. There are plenty of videos on YouTube that the Knights have produced to show the work they are doing over there. Fr. Kalisch has many moving stories from his own time serving with the Knights, but one particular story from the life of Fr. Michael McGivney, the founder of the Knights of Columbus, and beatified in 2020, struck me as especially important.

Fr. Michael McGivney was serving at St. Mary's Church in New Haven, Connecticut when he founded the Knights of Columbus, originally as a mutual aid society to provide assistance to widows and orphans. It became a fraternal society for men to support each other and serve the people of their community, and Fr. McGivney had a particular heart for men who had gone astray from a decent, moral life.

On December 28, 1880, a man named James "Chip" Smith got into an altercation with the police chief, Daniel Hayes. The police chief ended up being killed in that confrontation and James Smith was convicted and sentenced to death. Fr. McGivney regularly visited those imprisoned but took a special interest in James Smith. He encouraged him as the date of execution approached. There was a noticeable difference in the way Smith carried himself as he accepted his fate. During the summer leading up to the September 1, 1882 execution, Fr. McGivney visited Smith every day and even said a High Mass in the jail, days before Smith's execution, with a large choir and many parishioners attending. Father McGivney characterized his presence at the impending execution as "perhaps the most trying ordeal of my life." Smith told Fr. McGivney what a gift he was to him, saying: "Father, your saintly ministrations have enabled me to meet death without a tremor. Do not fear for me, I must not break down now."

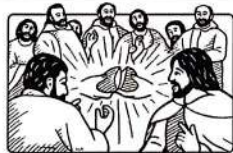
I relate this story because Fr. McGivney is the example of a priest with the heart of a true father to his people, and a brother to those he accompanied. He died in 1890, at the age of only 38. His heart was modeled after that of the Good Shepherd Himself. Pray that I can be like the Good Shepherd, too.

The mission of Fr. McGivney lives on in the work of the Knights of Columbus. We are honored to have our own faithful Council of the Knights of Columbus here in our parish. We are always looking for more good men from our parish to help us to continue this great work of service throughout our community. Thank you, to all the Knights in our parish, who have answered this call.
