FROM OUR PASTOR, FATHER AMATO

It is so important to understand our own history as Catholics because this is precisely what binds us all together. Whatever language we speak, or country we come from, we share the same story, no matter how God has called us into His Mystical Body. Within this Body there is the unique story of each individual person, family, and nation, but there is also the common story of a Church that exists in history; an eternal God who acts in time and became one of us in time; a God who taught us unchanging Truth so that we who live in this changing world can always

have a sure foundation.

Last weekend, we were blessed to be able to venerate relics from the bones of many saints, including the four evangelists, St. Peter, St. Paul, St. Mary Magdalene, and the True Cross. It can be an extremely powerful experience to spend time with such a reliquary. The bones of those Apostles and Evangelists, for example, were part of the same body of those saints who walked with Christ! The soul that formed that body now reigns in heaven, and so bears that connection with those pieces of bone that will rise on the Last Day when Christ returns in glory. This is a physical connection with the earthly life of our Lord.

The relic of the True Cross, of course, has particular importance because it is the wood "on which hung our salvation," as we sing on Good Friday. It is the instrument of our salvation. But you may ask, "How could we possibly know that we have the actual Cross of our Lord?"

It was September 14, AD 320, that St. Helen, the mother of Emperor Constantine, discovered three crosses during the excavation under the temple of Venus in Jerusalem. In order to find out which cross was the Cross of our Lord, two miracles occurred. The body of someone about to be buried was touched to each of the crosses. The person was restored to life at the touch of the True Cross. There was also a miraculous healing of another at the touch of the Cross.

On that site of the original Calvary, the site of the Crucifixion of Christ, a church and shrine were built and dedicated on September 13, 335. The next day, September 14, the Cross was brought into the church where it could be venerated by all. This feast day has been kept in Jerusalem since that day, and since the 5th or 6th centuries, by the entire Latin and Greek Church.



And yet there is another glorious occasion associated with this day. It begins with the conquering of Jerusalem by the Persian King Chosroes II, in the year AD 614. He burnt the church down and stole all the relics to be brought back with him. The church would eventually be rebuilt and restored multiple times – especially by the 12th century crusaders – throughout the centuries to the present day.

The Byzantine Emperor Heraclius had to do something to stop the Persian advance into Roman territory. The empire faced many defeats before Heraclius' counter-offensive would begin. It is a long and complicated story as to how Heraclius was able to pull off such an improbable victory, push the Persians back, and eventually take the war all the way to Chosroes' home. For a full treatment on this war, you can read, *The Last Great War of Antiquity*, by James Howard-Johnston.

In short, the True Cross was recovered and brought back to Jerusalem. Heraclius wanted to carry the Cross himself and place it in the rebuilt church on the holy site. At the entrance to the city, he was suddenly stopped by some unseen force. He could not move forward anymore. The patriarch of Jerusalem, Zachary, suggested to Heraclius that the pomp and ceremony with which he entered the city was not an appropriate imitation of Christ when He carried His Cross. He said to Heraclius, "You walk in your gaudy imperial robes; He was meanly clad. You have on your head a rich diadem; He was crowned with a wreath of thorns. You go with your shoes on; He walked barefoot." Heraclius then dressed in imitation of the Savior, and carried the Cross to its rightful place on Calvary, where it could again be venerated by all.

Wherever we encounter a relic of the True Cross, we not only come into contact with the instrument of our salvation, but we encounter this history as well, and we become more a part of it. As we just celebrated the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross on September 14, our thoughts now turn to the final part of our liturgical year and the expectation of the Lord's arrival.






