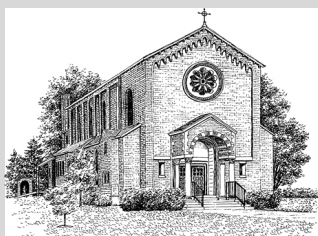


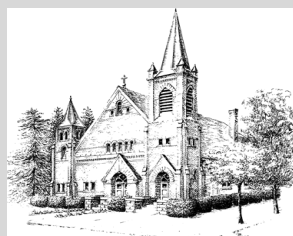

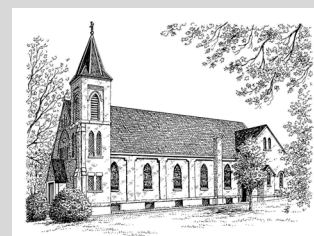

**FROM OUR PASTOR, FATHER VAN LIESHOUT**

Praised be Jesus Christ!

I have not yet had the chance to call attention in my column to the fact that we are already over one month into a special "Year of St. Joseph," which the Holy Father decreed would be celebrated from December 8<sup>th</sup>, 2020 until December 8<sup>th</sup>, 2021.

In recent decades, it has been common for the Church to designate various devotional years which focus the attention of the universal Church on some mystery of the faith or some element of Catholic piety. Looking back in the recent past, we had the "Year of Mercy" in 2016, the "Year of Faith" in 2013, the "Year of the Eucharist" in 2005, and many others.

Perhaps it's a flaw in my character or a symptom of my natural temperament, but I admit that I have a difficult time really getting excited about each of these particular "special" years.

Ideally, the importance of Sunday Mass, its reverent celebration, and regular parish Eucharistic preaching and devotions would make a "Year of the Eucharist" unnecessary. Ideally, regular admonitions about the importance of sacramental confession, its convenient availability in the parish, and the lived experience of God's mercy would likewise make such a "Year of Mercy" seem a redundancy. And again, ideally, the study of the Catholic faith is an ongoing effort for parishioners of all ages, such that, the proclamation of a "Year of Faith" would require little additional emphasis.

Canon law already obliges me in my duties as a Pastor to ensure "that the word of God is proclaimed in its entirety to those living in the parish" (canon 528.1) and to "take care that the blessed Eucharist is the center of the parish assembly of the faithful" (canon 528.2) and "strive to ensure that the faithful are nourished by the devout celebration of the sacraments, and in particular that they frequently approach the sacraments of the blessed Eucharist and penance" (Ibid). These seem to be the same goals as each of these focused devotional years.

But...

After saying all of the above, I want to be clear that I DO firmly believe that there are unique graces given by God to his Church during these such years, resulting in sometimes unexpected fruits in parishes and Dioceses which take full advantage of them. I have witnessed this first-hand in the past.

I also greatly welcome this particular invitation to cultivate a deeper devotion to St. Joseph, especially given the present turmoil both outside and inside the Church. St. Joseph is traditionally invoked under powerful titles such as: Chaste Guardian of the Virgin, Glory of Home Life, Pillar of Families, Terror of Demons, and Protector of Holy Church—all which (along with many others) I think speak to the present needs of the faithful.

And so I hope to find some helpful ways that we can "Ite ad Ioseph" ("Go to Joseph"), as the saying goes, during coming months in celebration of this special year.

In his letter announcing this year, the Holy Father revealed that for the past 40 years he has prayed every day a certain prayer in honor of St. Joseph which originally comes from a 19<sup>th</sup> Century French prayer book. He gives the prayer as follows:

*Glorious Patriarch Saint Joseph, whose power makes the impossible possible,  
come to my aid in these times of anguish and difficulty.  
Take under your protection the serious and troubling situations that I commend to you,  
that they may have a happy outcome.  
My beloved father, all my trust is in you. Let it not be said that I invoked you in vain,  
and since you can do everything with Jesus and Mary,  
show me that your goodness is as great as your power. Amen.*

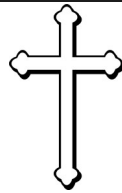
