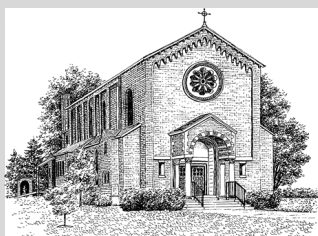


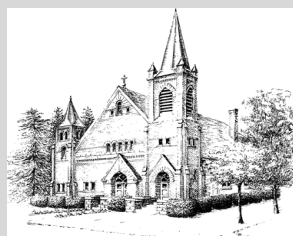

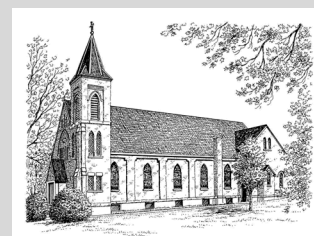

FROM OUR PASTOR, FATHER VAN LIESHOUT

Praised be Jesus Christ!

Earlier this week we finally reached 100% of our CMA goal in terms of "Amount Pledged." So long as all those pledges are fulfilled, then we will have successfully completed our parish portion of the 2020 Diocesan Appeal.

Thank you to all who made this possible! If you haven't yet made your pledge, you are still more than welcome to do so. Our parish receives back 50% on every dollar collected from our parishioners beyond our total goal.

I was always confident that our parish would be successful, but it's just nice to have it completed and know that we can stay on course with our annual parish budget on that item. It is also important to me personally for more obscure "theological/ecclesiological" reasons: the ontological priority of the Diocesan church over the local parish community, the Divine constitution of the Church as a complete society and not merely a voluntary association, and others (I won't confuse or bore you with the details, though I think they really ARE significant, in principle). We can at least appreciate the fact that it reflects well on our parish as a whole, and *THAT* is certainly something to be proud of.

On a very different note...

I realize that we are still a few weeks out from the start of Lent on Ash Wednesday (February 17th), but it is typically right around this time of year that I begin receiving a variety of questions of "ashes" – When will ashes be distributed? Can so and so receive ashes at home?, etc. I'm always amazed and somewhat edified at the "demand" for this particular sacramental. It is one of the few remaining cultural and public expressions of Catholic devotion that has wide recognition.

Given this reality, I think it is important to share in advance the instructions that we have received this year from Rome regarding how ashes are to be distributed given the continued health precautions. **The key difference is that the ashes are to be "sprinkled" on the top of the head/hair of each recipient, not rubbed on the forehead of the person in the shape of the cross, as is our normal custom.** This avoids direct contact between the priest/deacon with each person in the line and precludes the need for any "purification of fingers" between recipients, which is just not feasible given how difficult that would be.

Before anyone is tempted to lament yet another modification to our normal routine as Catholics, I want to point out that this manner of imposing ashes is actually already the standard method in use throughout most places in the Catholic world, and corresponds to the traditional Roman practice. It is actually **OUR** "cross on the forehead" method that is the anomaly in the Universal Church.

I remember finding this out first-hand during my first Ash Wednesday in Rome as a seminarian. I went to Mass early in the morning with all the other American seminarians, and then hurried off to theology classes at one of the Roman universities, which is attended by seminarians and clergy from various countries throughout the world. It was such a strange experience to watch these students from other countries stare in confusion at all the American seminarians as we filtered into the classroom. Once we sat down, some leaned over to say to those next to them: "it looks like you have some dirt on our foreheads." We Americans were so confused, thinking "don't these Catholic seminarians know what Ash Wednesday is?!" That's how we learn that our "ash distribution custom" was a bit more "in-your-face" than most other Catholic nations.

I just wanted to share this in advance to get ourselves accustomed to this idea. While it might not have the same bold, public effect that we typically experience, perhaps we appreciate how it better corresponds with the Gospel text of the day: "But when you fast, anoint your head and wash your face, so that you may not appear to be fasting, except to your Father who is hidden. And your Father who sees what is hidden will repay you" (Matthew 6:17-18).
