

FROM OUR PASTOR, FATHER AMATO

I pray that your Christmas Day was filled with true joy and peace, that joy that comes from knowing the Light of the world has come to cast out all darkness and to live among us. We now enter the Christmas Season, beginning with this Octave of Christmas, where we will contemplate the early life of Christ and the Mystery of His Incarnation. But first, we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family, and then, on the Octave Day of Christmas, January 1, we celebrate the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God.

Some might be wondering, "Didn't we just celebrate the Immaculate Conception on December 8? And our Lady of Loreto and Our Lady of Guadalupe? Do we need another Marian feast day on January 1?" Yes, we do. We must keep in our minds the fact that anything we say about Mary reflects back on what we believe about Christ, who He is, and who He has revealed Himself to be. By celebrating Mary under the various titles we have for her, and her various privileges given to her by God, we are amplifying the honor and glory we give to God who made Mary His greatest creature, a most holy Mother of the Redeemer.

This week, beginning with the Feast of the Holy Family, we have two beautiful bookends, with the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God, falling on a Saturday. Throughout the second chapter of Luke, there are three passages that refer to the heart of Mary, two of which are explicitly mention her heart, and those are the ones given to us for the Feast of the Holy Family and for the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God.

For the Feast of the Holy Family, we read the Gospel telling us about the Finding in the Temple (Fifth Joyful Mystery of the Rosary): "He went down with them and came to Nazareth, and was obedient to them; and his mother kept all these things in her heart" (Luke 2:51).

On the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God, we read how shepherds "make haste to Bethlehem and found Mary and Joseph, and the infant lying in a manger." When the shepherds told everyone what the angelic host had proclaimed to them, we are told that "Mary kept all these things, reflecting on them in her heart" (Luke 2:19).

In between these passages from the Gospel of Luke, we read about Jesus' Presentation in the Temple, when Simeon prophesied about Jesus, and told Mary, "Behold, this child is destined for the fall and rise of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be contradicted (and you yourself a sword will pierce) so that the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed" (Luke 2:34-35).

It is in the heart of the Immaculate Mother that we can find knowledge of her Divine Son. Why is this? It is because Mary is not only the perfect disciple, but she shows us the model of all prayer. When she saw something of her Son that astounded her and caused her to wonder, she turned to contemplation. She wanted to know nothing but Christ. Nothing but God can satisfy a soul destined for heaven. We have a privileged time of year in this Christmas Season to contemplate, with Mary, how the infinite God could be born into this world as a child, and yet also as its King and Redeemer.

Finally, I want to thank all of you for the incredible amount of cards, gifts, cookies, etc., that you have given me for Christmas. It means a lot to me, knowing of your love and appreciation. May this Christmas Season be blessed for you and your families.
