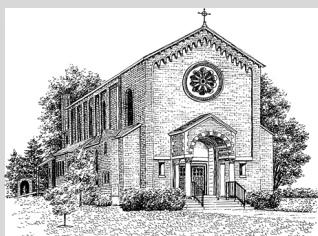


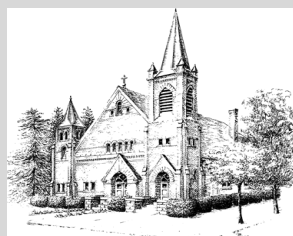

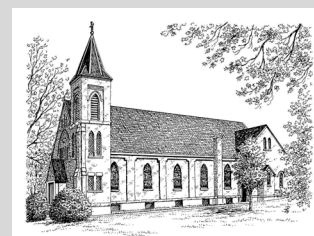

FROM OUR PASTOR, FATHER VAN LIESHOUT

Praised be Jesus Christ!

St. Paul, under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, gives a remarkable statement about suffering that has implications for our understanding of the importance of Lenten penance. He says:

*Now I rejoice in my sufferings for your sake, and in my flesh I **complete what is lacking in Christ's afflictions** for the sake of his body, that is, the church (Col 1:24).*

When encountering this verse, people sometimes struggle to understand why St. Paul speaks of something "lacking" in the sufferings of Christ. After all, wasn't Christ's death on the cross the perfect act of redemption? Isn't it the super-sufficient source of merit and the very wellspring of our salvation? If so, how can anything be lacking?

But St. Paul certainly isn't intending to downplay the work of Christ in any way. What is "lacking" in the sufferings of Christ is not anything intrinsic to Christ's saving work, but rather our **individual participation and sharing in those sufferings of Christ as members of his body**. The implication is that God's plan of salvation is so great that in and through the merits of Christ, he allows even our sufferings (whether voluntary penances or just those sufferings that life throws our way) to have value for ourselves and for others when united to Christ's. Stated differently, Christ allows us to transform our sorrows and pains from something seemingly senseless into something incredibly central to our spiritual lives.

This is also one of the reasons why Christ Himself taught very clearly what are the requirements of being his follower: "Whoever would come after me must **deny himself**, take up his cross, and follow me" (Matthew 16:24).

One spiritual author explains it as follows:

Through Baptism we have been incorporated in Christ, and since we share His life we are to share His sentiments. Although impeccable, Jesus has taken upon Himself the burden of our sins...He gives Himself as an offering in the place of all victims [of the Old Covenant]. All His acts constitute an immolation through obedience, and after a lifelong martyrdom, He dies on the Cross, the victim of obedience and of love...But since His mystical body is one, if the head be immolated, the members likewise become living victims.

(Tanquerey, n. 737)

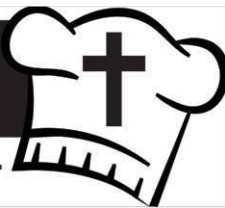
The language of "victimhood" has a very different connotation in secular culture than it does in our Catholic spiritual tradition. For us it means something ultimately positive—to be so united to Christ that we share profoundly in his work of redemption even in our sufferings. It is Christ working his redemption in and through us who are connected to him by baptism and grace.

All this is **some** of the theological framework underlying our understanding of Lenten penances and mortifications—what we might call the "ecclesiological" reasons for Christian penance. In the next two weeks, I'll outline two more theological reasons, but in the meantime just note that it is not too late to take full advantage of this holy season. We still have lots of Lent to go, so if you've started out poorly, take steps now to make this a spiritually profitable time!

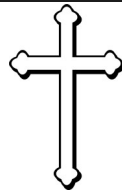
