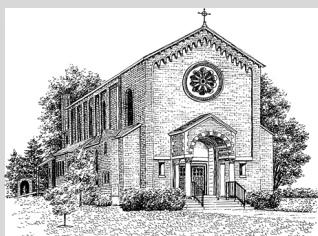


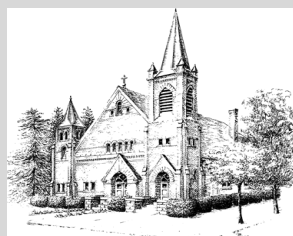

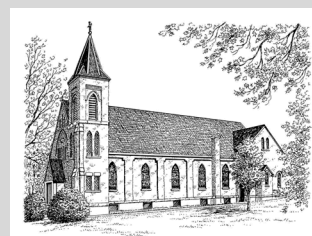

FROM OUR PASTOR, FATHER VAN LIESHOUT

Praised be Jesus Christ!

I want to complete my discussion of the importance of voluntary penance in the Christian life that I began a few weeks back.

I first noted that penitential practices are an important way of **sharing in the sufferings of Christ as members of his mystical body**, calling to mind St. Paul's interesting statement in his letter to the Colossians: "Now I rejoice in my sufferings for your sake, and in my flesh I complete what is lacking in Christ's afflictions for the sake of his body, that is, the church."

Two weeks ago I wrote about a slightly different aspect of penance, namely, that it involves **the remission of temporal punishment due to sin**—best understood from the perspective of God as a loving Father "disciplining" us his adopted children: "For the Lord disciplines him whom he loves, and chastises every son whom he receives. It is for discipline that you have to endure. God is treating you as sons; for what son is there whom his father does not discipline?"

Today, I would like us to see penance and mortification as an important means of **rooting out vices and growing in virtue**. Here the classic scriptural to point to is one that is frequently read in the liturgy toward the beginning of Lent:

*Do you not know that in a race all the runners compete, but only one receives the prize? So run that you may obtain it. Every athlete exercises self-control in all things. They do it to receive a perishable wreath, but we an imperishable. Well, I do not run aimlessly, I do not box as one beating the air; but I pommel my body and subdue it, lest after preaching to others I myself should be disqualified (1 Cor. 9: 24-27).*

The comparison here between the Christian spiritual life and the training of an athlete is extremely helpful. When I am out of shape physically (as I often am), it is not just that I'm "not exercising enough," but I am almost always habituated to many other unhealthy practices—too much snacking, unhealthy meal choices, not getting adequate sleep, etc. In a parallel way in the spiritual life when someone is not practicing at least some regular forms of mortification, it is far more likely that such a person is also habituated sinful inclinations/vices which are also not being resisted.

Every time that we sin, we incline ourselves toward that same behavior more easily in the future. And when the pattern of sinful or disordered behavior becomes a sort of "second nature" this is where we say that the person has developed some particular **vice**. Note that this takes place at the level of body as well as at the level of the soul. The medical study of addiction and addictive behaviors reveals a complex web of neurological and endocrinological triggers and stimuli which make repetitive destructive behavior so likely, even in cases in which the person desperately "wills/desires" never to fall back into their former actions.

Of course, the opposite of vice is **virtue**—a habituation in behavior which inclines us to do good more easily and "naturally." And the only normal way of growing in these kinds of virtues and rooting out vice is the persistent repetition of good actions (especially difficult ones particularly contrary to our vices) and the practice of denying ourselves regularly through some kind of mortification so as to train ourselves to resist our lower impulses and pursue higher goods.

Another way of saying this—**when a person gets used to saying "No" to their non-sinful desires regularly through voluntary penance it becomes much easier to say "No" to their sinful temptations when these involuntarily arise.**

Please note: this doesn't have to involve heroic efforts! Beginners should follow the example of St. Therese's "Little Way" of doing small things with great love. Spiritual authors often give simple suggestions that can be very effective when consistently followed—eat just a little bit less at a meal than you had planned, don't put additional seasoning on your food so that it is more bland than you might like, resolve to go to bed and wake up at a set time, do some of your daily prayers on your knees (if they are still functioning well), limit your internet or TV usage each day to a pre-determined amount of time & keep it faithfully, etc.

Most important of all, we should resolve to bear patiently and with willful acceptance all of the daily crosses that come our way in this "valley of tears": sickness, financial hardships, loneliness, family struggles, and the like. These are, in many ways, the primary means that God provides in order to fashion us according to his Providential plan.

**WHY ARE THE STATUES VEILED?**  
 The 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Lent was traditionally the start of "Passiontide", the period of two weeks leading up to the Triduum. One of the most distinctive aspects of Passiontide are the veils used to cover the statues and images throughout the Church. There are several classic reasons given for this practice.  
 1. They are a visible and striking way of calling attention to the fact that Holy Week and the Sacred Triduum are drawing near.  
 2. They are meant to hinder our sense of sight during worship so as to heighten the effectiveness of our other senses for those same weeks—especially the sense of hearing when the long narratives of the Passion are read on Palm Sunday and Good Friday.  
 3. They are a form of aesthetic "fasting of the eyes" which makes us long for the day of Easter when the veils will be removed, the Church will be decorated again with flowers in full beauty, and the Easter season of feasting begins.

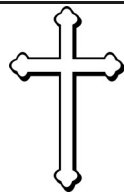
