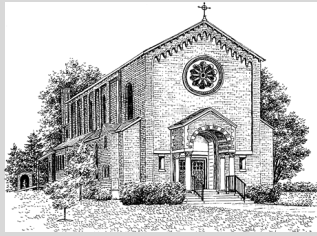
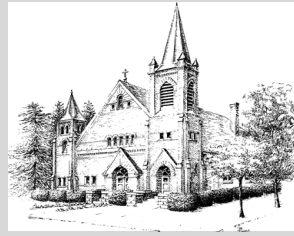


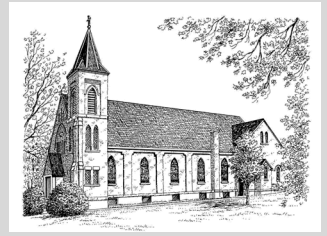

FROM OUR PASTOR, FATHER VAN LIESHOUT

Praised be Jesus Christ!

I have rejoiced over the last several weeks to see more and more parishioners funneling back to Mass. Whatever we can do to make that trend continue, let's keep it going! Sometimes it just takes a simple invitation: "Are you coming back to Mass soon?" For others who have remained quite isolated, you might suggest that they begin by attending one of the weekday Masses, which allows the person to rebuild the habit while becoming comfortable once again in the pews.

But with such a wide range of sensitivities, it can be difficult for priests to strike the right tone between those who have been back since early June and those who are just beginning to take those steps. Instead of trying to walk that line by finding the perfect, nuanced words, I guess I just exhort everyone in charity to be aware of these various sensitivities, but to set before our eyes this goal: **That Jesus Christ be more perfectly and abundantly praised, adored, and loved in this parish at all times.**

We OWE to Christ our worship and our love, as we say in the preface of the Mass: "It is truly right and just, our duty and our salvation, always and everywhere to give you thanks, Lord, holy Father, almighty and eternal God!" I would love for that sentiment to be the driving force behind the next few weeks as I finish my time as Pastor of St. Peter's parish and as we get ready to welcome Fr. Amato.

Can we offer up any of the inconveniences, frustrations, fears, annoyances, etc. of these still awkward times in order to console the heart of Christ, who is so often forgotten and offended?

Can we love our Eucharistic Lord with a fervency that repairs for all the many Sundays last year in which he was alone in a church of empty pews?

Can we fill our churches to a standing-room capacity to make up for the places where still to this day, parishes are closed and shuttered?

Can we resolve to cultivate a deeper and deeper love for Holy Mass, that allows us to say, along with some of the early Christian martyrs: "*Sine dominico, non possumus*"- "We cannot live, without the Sunday Eucharist?"

I ask all of these questions not with a tone of a rebuke, but out of a loving and confident challenge!

One holy card about the Mass that was recently given to me by one of our parishioners reads:

At the hour of death, the Masses you have heard will be your greatest consolation. Every Mass will go with you to judgment and plead for pardon. At every Mass, you can diminish the temporal punishment due to your sins. Assisting devoutly at Mass, you render the Sacred Humanity of Jesus the greatest homage. He supplies for many of your negligences and omissions. He forgives you all the venial sins you are determined to avoid...Holy Mass preserves you from many dangers and misfortunes that would otherwise befall you....At Mass, you kneel amidst a multitude of angels who are present at the adorable Sacrifice with reverential awe!
