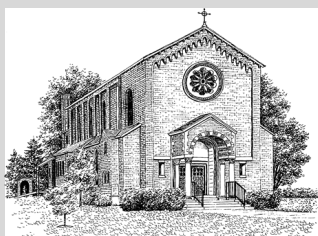
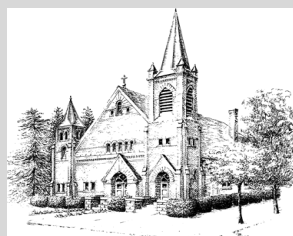


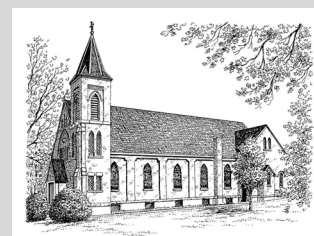

FROM OUR PASTOR, FATHER VAN LIESHOUT

Praised be Jesus Christ!

I almost never save the handwritten notes that I use at the pulpit during the delivery of my Sunday homily. Most of the time they are just bulletin points of basic ideas that I want to make sure to cover. Sometimes I scribble them down so quickly I can barely read the points myself, and if I were to go back and read them at a later point, I'm not even sure that I could reestablish the train of thought that I had at the time. Plus, by tossing them out I protect myself against the temptation to go back and repeat sermons or segments I have already given. I figure that if I can write something worthwhile, I should be able to do it again fresh. I say all this because it was interesting for me this week that as I was reluctantly starting to gather my things and pack up that I ran across the paperclipped stack of notes that I used to deliver my very first homily on the first weekend of my arrival in St. Peter's parish—what I think was July 1st and 2nd of 2017.

- A lot of the beginning of it was just biographical details: my family, my upbringing, my educational experiences, some of my vocation story, etc. There was even a short section in there about how to correctly pronounce my last name!
- I was surprised by one section in which I apparently felt the need to address the fact that I was quite young and even offer some basic defense of my experiences up to that point which I thought would help me to be prepared as a Parochial Administrator (as I was then, before I was appointed Pastor) even despite my relative youth. While four years isn't that long of time I guess I "feel" noticeably less "youthful" now than I did back then—and I have the receding hairline to prove it.
- I also smiled as I glanced through my notes about asking for the goodwill and the patience of the parishioners during my transition into the parish—especially when I assured all of you that I would inevitably do things over the course of my time here that would at times annoy or anger you, and I apologized in advance. I have no doubt that in plenty of cases I succeeded in doing just that, but in retrospect I never could have imagined how patient, cooperative, trusting, and forgiving of me that you would end up being. Thank you for that.

But other than those points, the substance of the homily was something so recognizable as it contained the basic outline of the "pastoral plan" that has informed my motivations and decisions throughout these past years.

I resolved to preach the fullness of the Catholic faith—and I quoted directly from the Code of Canon Law in its explanation of the role of the Pastor: "A pastor is obliged to make provision so that the word of God is proclaimed in its entirety to those living in the parish; for this reason, he is to take care that the lay members of the Christian faithful are instructed in the truths of the faith, especially by giving a homily on Sundays and holy days of obligation and by offering catechetical instruction" (canon 528, §1).

I resolved to give the Sacraments and prepare you for their worthy reception. My emphasis on the importance of frequent confession and reverent liturgical prayer comes right from the same place: "[The Pastor] is to work so that the Christian faithful are nourished through the devout celebration of the sacraments and, in a special way, that they frequently approach the sacraments of the Most Holy Eucharist and penance. He is also to endeavor that they are led to practice prayer even as families and take part consciously and actively in the sacred liturgy...and is bound to watch over so that no abuses creep in" (canon 528, §2).

And finally I noted what was my specific pastoral priority (I even wrote the words "My pastoral priority" in the margin of the text), namely, **Eucharistic centrality**: "The pastor is to see to it that the Most Holy Eucharist is the center of the parish assembly of the faithful" (canon 528, §2).

* * *

I share all of this not as some sort of triumphal note of departure, but more as a bittersweet way of reminiscing back to some of the hopes and anxieties I experienced when I first arrived. And trust me...I know and could articulate the many ways in which I did not live up to those same resolutions, or carried them out ineffectively!

I'll have some concluding reflections next week in my final homily as a bookend to these wonderful last four years that I've had in this parish.
