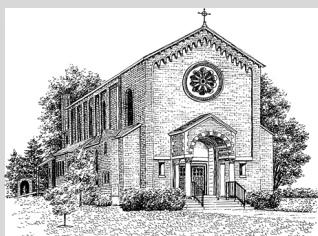


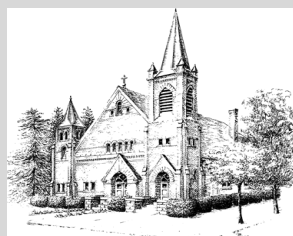

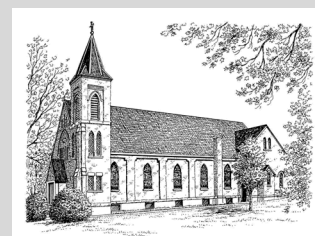

FROM OUR PASTOR, FATHER VAN LIESHOUT

Praised be Jesus Christ!

There is a touching scene recounted in Acts 20 when St. Paul is at Miletus and calls to himself the elders of the church from Ephesus so that he can speak to them a word of farewell. He is heading up to Jerusalem, which will trigger a series of events that will lead to his arrest, imprisonment, and eventual trial in Rome. And despite the fact that after several years he will eventually be released (for a time, prior to his eventual martyrdom), St. Paul knows that this will be the last time that he will see these Ephesians.

He says:

You yourselves know how I lived among you all the time from the first day that I set foot in Asia, serving the Lord with all humility and with tears and with trials which befell me...how I did not shrink from declaring to you anything that was profitable, and teaching you in public and from house to house, testifying both to Jews and to Greeks of repentance to God and of faith in our Lord Jesus Christ. ... I do not account my life of any value nor as precious to myself, if only I may accomplish my course and the ministry which I received from the Lord Jesus, to testify to the gospel of the grace of God. And now, behold, I know that all you among whom I have gone preaching the kingdom will see my face no more. Therefore I testify to you this day that I am innocent of the blood of all of you, for I did not shrink from declaring to you the whole counsel of God...I know that after my departure fierce wolves will come in among you, not sparing the flock; and from among your own selves will arise men speaking perverse things, to draw away the disciples after them. Therefore be alert, remembering that for three years I did not cease night or day to admonish every one with tears. And now I commend you to God and to the word of his grace, which is able to build you up and to give you the inheritance among all those who are sanctified. I coveted no one's silver or gold or apparel. You yourselves know that these hands ministered to my necessities, and to those who were with me. In all things I have shown you that by so toiling one must help the weak, remembering the words of the Lord Jesus, how he said, 'It is more blessed to give than to receive.'

St. Paul then kneels down and prays with them as they weep and embrace him for the last time.

Now I realize that it would be the heights of delusional egoism for a simple parish priest to compare his work to the paradigmatic apostolic ministry of St. Paul—and I want to be clear that I'm not intending to do that.

But the main points of this "farewell discourse" at least echo in my thoughts and sentiments on this last Sunday in St. Peter's Parish.

"I did not shrink from declaring to you the whole counsel of God" - I can confidently say that all I've ever truly wanted here was to make Jesus Christ and his Church more known and loved. Being human, I'm sure that this desire was sometimes tainted by my own pride or dimmed by my sins. But I never preached or taught anything out of a vague sense of duty or some type of human motive—only and always out of the firm conviction that the Catholic faith, in its entirety, is TRUE. And because it is true, it is worth spending my life to explain, defend, and propagate it.

"I know that after my departure fierce wolves will come in among you, not sparing the flock"— It is such a consolation to know that I hand you over to the pastoral care of a good priest who will love you and sacrifice himself in pastoral labor for the good of your souls. But it is always the case that there are "wolves" seeking to divide and confuse the flock of Christ. In particular, there are powerful cultural forces at work today which are disseminated within secular society with a religious fervor that makes our evangelization efforts pale in comparison. Please be watchful and alert! It is a mistake in general to think that the proponents of this militant secularism/"woke"-culture seek to persecute the Church out of existence as was the case in the early centuries under the Roman Empire. Today the goal is accomplished simply by convincing believers that there is no real difference between their religious belief and the slogans of the secular world. Therein lies the real danger.

"It is more blessed to give than to receive."— I've written before in past bulletins about how I sometimes feel like a proud father when I look out at the parish and see genuine spiritual fervor, devout reception of the Sacraments, people returning to confession after years or even decades away from it, serious study of the faith and the Scriptures, etc. To whatever extent that Christ was able to use me to accomplish some of that, I'm just so humbled, and yet at the same, like I said--proud like an over-zealous father gloating over his children's accomplishments. Thank you for your patience with me and your cooperation over the course of these last four years. You have an incredible opportunity under your new Pastor to continue to build up the parish, and especially to reach out to those who have fallen away from the practice of the faith, or even perhaps those who felt unable to "connect" with me and my particular style or personality. The Catholic faith is thankfully infinitely more rich than any one individual priest.

Please pray for me in my new assignment, which will involve unique and new challenges, that I may be ever more conformed to the heart of Jesus Christ, our great high priest.
