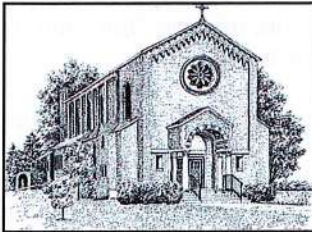

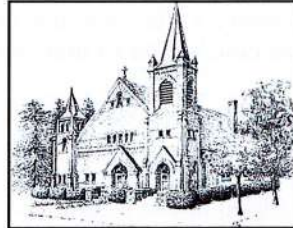

## FROM OUR PASTOR, FATHER AMATO

Merry Christmas, again, to all of you, and happy Octave of Christmas, the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God! I wish all of you a happy and blessed New Year as well. We begin this new year as we begin (and end) all things: with prayer and the worship of God. We are fortunate this year that both Christmas and therefore its Octave Day (New Years' Day) both fall on a Sunday. We have such glorious feast days, and a whole week to celebrate Christmas, all within a regular week. I hope you were able to take advantage of some of the Masses throughout the week as the feast days within the Octave of Christmas are particularly beautiful and significant for our faith, as they relate to the beginnings of the spread of the Gospel.

The day after Christmas we celebrated St. Stephen, the Protomartyr, who was stoned to death for his profession of faith and defense of the Gospel (Acts of the Apostles 6:8-10; 7:54-59). December 27 is the feast of St. John the Apostle, the Beloved Disciple, author of the Gospel John, the Epistles of John, and the Book of Revelation (though two of the epistles and Revelation may be from John 'the Elder'). He is also the only Apostle not martyred. I will talk more about him in a minute. Finally, the trio of feasts concludes with the Holy Innocents on December 28, martyrs who, because of the cruelty of Herod, became "the Church's first blossoms, matured by the frost of persecution during the cold winter of unbelief" (as St. Augustine tells us).

Each of these feast days showed us something of how to follow Christ, as the saints always do, but John, in particular, is significant for us as we celebrate the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God.

We know John as the Beloved Disciple, the one who stood at the foot of the Cross with Mary, remaining while all others had fled. Before that moment, at the Last Supper, he was the one who reclined on the chest of Jesus (John 13:23). In their culture at that time, they would recline at meals on their left side, most likely arranged in a semi-circle, so they could reach for food with their right hand. *John heard the heartbeat of God.* He felt it, and more importantly, lived by it. He preached the love of God and the love that we must have for one another out of our love for God.

Notice in the verses following 13:23, Jesus says that one of the Apostles will betray Him, and Peter motions to John to ask Jesus who it is that will betray Him. He was the one closest to the Heart of the Lord and so he was able to know such secrets of His Heart. This is how I see *Eucharistic Adoration* as well. We come close to the beating Heart of God, which beats out of love of for us, for whom He gave His life. It is the same heart that John heard beating at the Last Supper. Even after the Resurrection, John is identified as the one who Jesus loved and who reclined on the chest of Jesus (John 21:20). He is given that specific designation.

Finally, the connection with John and the Lord's Heart is shown so clearly to us when Jesus gave Mary to John as his mother, and John to Mary as her son (John 19:26-27). Is there anyone more fitting to take the Mother of God into his own home than the one who knew the heartbeat of the Incarnate Lord? Is there anyone more fitting for the Mother of God to take as her own son?

The Blessed Virgin Mary and the Apostle John are so much alike because they are close to the Heart of the Lord. For us, we can learn to see the Lord's beating Heart in the Most Holy Eucharist, anytime we come to Him at Mass or in Eucharistic Adoration. This is how John becomes for us the model of all disciples. This is why he stands in the place of all the baptized, representing all of us as true children of the Blessed Virgin Mary. She is truly the Mother of God, the Mother of the Incarnate Second Person of the Trinity, but by our baptism into Christ, she becomes our Mother too.

In the Apostle John, we see how the Hearts of Jesus and Mary are united. John showed his love for the Lord by caring for His Mother. As disciples of Christ, we honor Mary as the Mother of God today, inviting her to live in our homes as well, asking her to lead us into the Heart of her Divine Son.

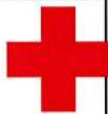
