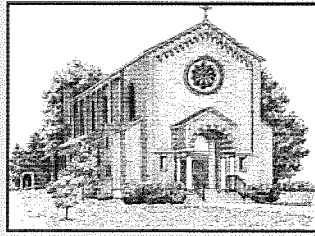
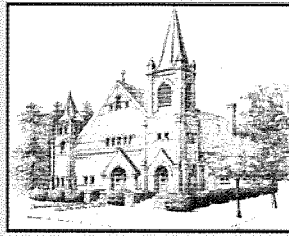


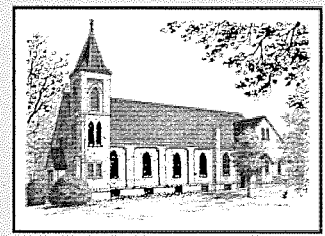

FROM OUR PASTOR, FATHER AMATO

Last year when I was writing a series of articles on the Roman Canon for you, taking each prayer and explaining the theology and spirituality behind it, I pointed out two prayers in particular where we can apply our own intentions to the Mass, the *Memento* of the Living and the *Memento* of the Dead. But what does it mean to apply our own intentions?

First, we have to understand who is offering the Mass, who is the celebrant. It is Christ who is the principal Offerer; the priest – who acts in the name of Christ and also of the Church – is the *ministerial* offerer; the Church is the *general* offerer; and the all the faithful who in any way participate at a Mass are called the *special* offerers.

This may all sound technical, but it is important to make these distinctions. What we give to God at the Mass (adoration, praise, thanksgiving) has its effects for our lives. These effects are called the “fruits” of the Mass. There are the *impetratory* fruits which are simply the benefits, both spiritual and temporal, we receive by our petitions and intentions. There are the *propitiatory* fruits which obtain for us the forgiveness of (venial) sins, turning away the wrath of God. Finally there are the *satisfactory* fruits of the Mass which are applied to those in a state of grace for the remission of temporal punishment due to sin. When we have a Mass offered for someone, or we participate at any Mass, these are the benefits we are receiving.

All of these fruits, or effects, of the Mass flow from the fact that it is Christ who offers this Sacrifice, and also from the act of the Church, independently of the sanctity of the priest. Taking those three categories of “fruits” of the Mass, we can then see how exactly those fruits are applied based on those who are offering the Mass. There are four categories.

The “general” fruits are applied to all members of the Church, living and dead, who have no obstacle in them to the reception of such grace. These are graces that flow just from the act of the Sacrifice being offered. Mainly the fruits are impetratory and propitiatory. But we can see from this that just by the fact that the Mass is being celebrated, grace is flowing out to the world, and the world is better because of it.

The “special” fruits are those gained by anyone who cooperates in any way in the celebration of Mass. So, all those present at Mass receive these fruits even by merely being present while this Sacrifice is taking place. Of course, we benefit more when we take the time to prepare our intentions for the Mass. For example, we may want to offer the Mass for the health of loved ones, for their conversion, for an increase of faith, etc. The “personal” fruits are those that are given to the priest celebrating the Mass.

Finally, there are the “ministerial” fruits. This is the Mass intention as stated in the bulletin, for example. When we say we are “having a Mass said” for some particular person or intention, we mean that the ministerial fruits are applied for that intention. So, at the *Memento* of the Living and of the Dead, when I pause, I make explicit mention of the intention for the Mass, but I also ask the Lord to apply other fruits of the Mass for various intentions (impetratory fruits) that I have on my heart. At the time of the *Memento* of the Dead, I make special mention for all whom you have on your hearts for whom who are praying at that moment.

All of this is part of our *active participation* as we come before the throne of God and prepare our whole being to offer this most perfect Sacrifice.

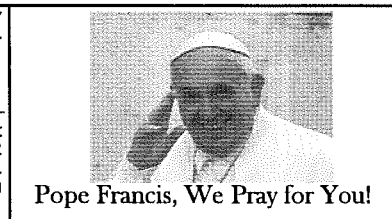
