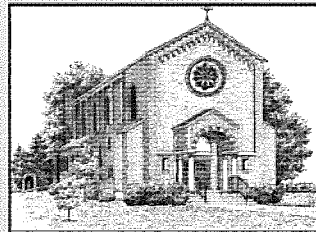
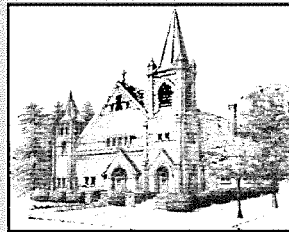


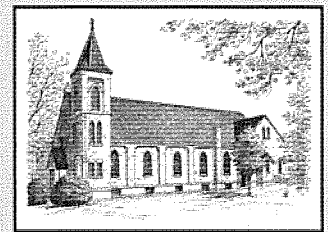

FROM OUR PASTOR, FATHER AMATO

After spending a couple weeks taking another look at the norms given to us by the Second Vatican Council's Constitution on the Liturgy, *Sacrosanctum Concilium*, we can now look deeper at the specific parts of the Mass. Again, we turn to the "instruction manual" for the Mass, the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* (GIRM), to see what the Church expects of us in our worship.

Here, I will show what the GIRM tells us about which music is to be sung at the various parts of the Mass: Entrance, Preparation of the Gifts/ Offertory, and Communion. It is interesting to note that there is nothing prescribed for what to sing at the end of Mass. The Mass is concluded with the priest reverencing the altar. Of course, it does not mean it is wrong to sing something. I am just pointing out that there is nothing specifically prescribed as at the other parts of Mass.

Also, we have begun singing a hymn after Communion, but before the Prayer after Communion. The instruction for this comes in paragraph 88: "When the distribution of Communion is over, if appropriate, the Priest and faithful pray quietly for some time. If desired, a Psalm or other canticle of praise or a hymn may also be sung by the whole congregation."

So now, what does the Church tell us to sing at the specific parts of the Mass? Here is paragraph 48 from the GIRM, regarding the Entrance:

"48. This chant is sung alternately by the choir and the people or similarly by a cantor and the people, or entirely by the people, or by the choir alone. In the Dioceses of the United States of America, there are four options for the Entrance Chant: (1) the antiphon from the Missal or the antiphon with its Psalm from the *Graduale Romanum*, as set to music there or in another setting; (2) the antiphon and Psalm of the *Graduale Simplex* for the liturgical time; (3) a chant from another collection of Psalms and antiphons, approved by the Conference of Bishops or the Diocesan Bishop, including Psalms arranged in responsorial or metrical forms; (4) another liturgical chant that is suited to the sacred action, the day, or the time of year, similarly approved by the Conference of Bishops or the Diocesan Bishop. If there is no singing at the Entrance, the antiphon given in the Missal is recited either by the faithful, or by some of them, or by a reader; otherwise, it is recited by the Priest himself, who may even adapt it as an introductory explanation (cf. no. 31)."

We can notice here how in the first three options there are references to chant from sources called the *Graduale Romanum* and the *Graduale Simplex*. These sources are the *official* sources for chanting the Psalms. The Church has already given to us how the Psalms are to be chanted, whether in a more full, complicated form, or in the more simple and more "accessible" form (*Graduale Simplex*). In the older form of the Mass, there was no "Responsorial Psalm" after the First Reading. There was the "Gradual" followed by the "Alleluia" and its verse. This is still an option in the Mass today (GIRM, 61).

The fourth option given here is typically taken to mean we can sing a hymn, even though it says "another liturgical chant" can be sung. This, of course, is our typical experience of the Mass in most churches: singing a few thematically related hymns throughout the Mass. Sometimes it can feel like these hymns do not necessarily have much connection to what is actually happening in the liturgy. In my life, I have often felt that hymns were simply there to "keep us busy" while the priest was doing something in the sanctuary. Gregorian chant takes the words of the Mass itself and allows us to *sing the Mass*, instead of only singing *at Mass*. Last Fall, I wrote a series of articles on the Roman Canon, which included how we are to participate in the liturgy, not just externally, but internally as well. Having a missal in the pews helps with that. I am not saying that everything must now be chanted. Hymnody has a proper place in the liturgy and singing a hymn after Communion is a good development. My goal is to simply point out the role that chant has in the Mass, even today, and to bring us to a greater appreciation of the role of hymnody in our Roman Rite.
