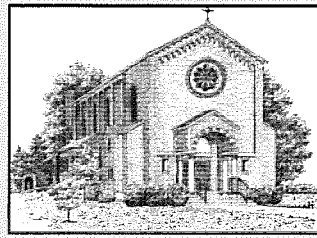
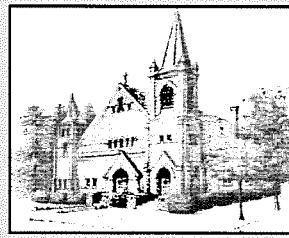


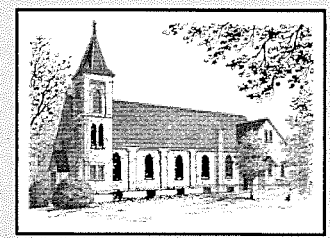

FROM OUR PASTOR, FATHER AMATO

As a final comment here on the topic of liturgical music, and hymnody in particular, I want to note two general guidelines when choosing hymns. These come from a document published by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) in 2020. The whole document is worth reading as it gives specific examples of good liturgical hymns and the reasons why quite a few hymns that had become popular are actually deficient in some serious ways regarding the way they present the Catholic Faith.

The document begins by pointing out how, from the earliest days of Christianity, hymns have been used to form people in the proper doctrine of the Faith. Of course, hymns do not have to adhere to strict doctrinal formulae, but they cannot trivialize core elements of the Faith either. The best sources for hymns are the Scriptures and other liturgical sources that have been handed down to us. It is in our public worship, most especially the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, where the Word of God lives. All that we do in terms of our prayers and singing is an expression of that Mystery that has been communicated so beautifully throughout the ages in the Church's worship.

And so, when we look at hymns, we are guided by two basic questions: "(1) Is the hymn in conformity with Catholic doctrine? and (2) Is the hymn expressed in image and vocabulary appropriately reflective of the usage of Scripture and the public liturgical prayer of the Church?" (USCCB, *Catholic Hymnody*, 2). I believe our current hymnals/missals have hymns, both new and old, that adequately express our Faith in beautiful song. And even at times when we may not yet know the melody, God will certainly still be pleased with our efforts to sing His praises.

When we look at the text of a hymn, we will notice that most hymns have a logical progression, or tell some story, or even speak directly to (or in praise of) the Persons of the Trinity. To leave out verses for the sake of time gives the impression that hymnody is merely about passing the time while the priest is doing something, as I mentioned last week. By omitting verses, we may also omit important points of doctrine or leave out one of the Persons of the Trinity (depending on that particular hymn). This is why we now sing a hymn of thanksgiving/praise in its entirety, after Communion. I know I have thoroughly enjoyed singing the hymn after Communion because I have no other duties in the sanctuary at that moment. I can just sing and pray the lyrics.

Finally, besides the lyrics, liturgical music should have a certain quality that conveys the solemnity of the occasion. We all know appropriate melodies when we hear it, based on the circumstances. And if we do not know what the occasion is, the music can help us determine that because it sets an atmosphere and a culture within that space. If the music lends itself to a party-like atmosphere, our attitudes, gestures, and conversation will be far more casual. Music has that kind of power. At Mass, the re-presentation of the Sacrifice of Calvary, the music should convey the sense of solemnity, serenity, and joy that fits the occasion of this celebration of the Paschal Mystery, while leading us deeper into prayer.

We praise God for the great musical tradition of our Catholic Faith that has formed the faith and worship of countless souls throughout the centuries.

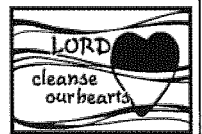

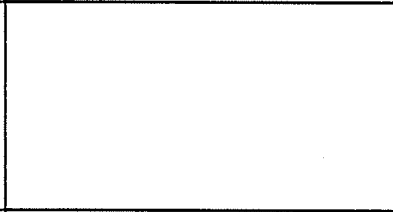

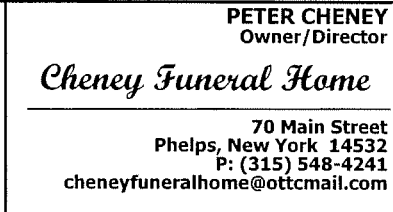
