

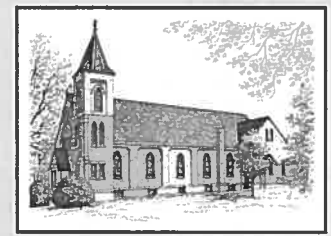

FROM OUR PASTOR, FATHER AMATO

This week you probably received your letter regarding this year's Catholic Ministries Appeal campaign for our diocese. Our goal increased this year by a few thousand dollars. This is due to our consistent success as a parish, which of course is fundamentally about your commitment to our parish, our diocese, and our faith.

Last week, I preached on how the unfaithful steward in the parable secured for himself a living after he lost his job. By his "prudence," he deceived the rich man, but made friends with the debtors. Jesus then tells His hearers, "I tell you, make friends for yourselves with dishonest wealth, so that when it fails, you will be welcomed into eternal dwellings" (Luke 16:9). The Kingdom of God belongs to those who are poor and righteous. Our Lord has a special love for them as he repeats often, most especially in Matthew 25:31-46. Last week I also referenced the parable of the rich man and Lazarus, which we hear this weekend, and which occurs just a few verses after last week's Gospel. The Gospel of Luke is clearly trying to tell us something.

While we all have our own particular sphere of influence and the people with which we interact in our daily life, we are also part of a greater body of believers, the Body of Christ. Besides the awareness of the needs of those around us, we are also reminded of the reality of the Church. Each diocese is a "local church," that is, a body of believers, governed by a bishop, in communion with the Bishop of Rome, the Pope. A few times I have preached on the idea that we have to take care of the needs right in front of us. And if everyone does that, the world will be claimed for Christ. If we take care of our families, and our families take care of the needs of the parish, and each parish is thriving, making up the whole diocese, then our "local church" will be secure. So, while we have responsibilities to those in our immediate vicinity, we also have a responsibility to those in the wider Body of our local church. This is the purpose of the Catholic Ministries Appeal in our diocese. I know you know this, given your great support of our CMA over the years, but it is always good to be reminded why we make this appeal.

For me, one of the most important needs supplied by the CMA is the education of our seminarians. We are well aware of the priest shortage in our diocese. Providing for the education of our seminarians is a tremendous burden relieved from those studying for the priesthood. The rising costs of college tuition also affects seminaries and the schools that our seminarians attend. Allowing men to discern the priesthood free from that financial burden allows them to discern more clearly, since they will not be tied to heavy school loans. Please continue to pray for vocations to the priesthood in our diocese.

Thank you so much for all of your past support of the CMA, and I am confident we will have a successful campaign again this year.

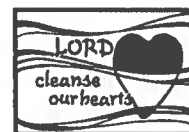

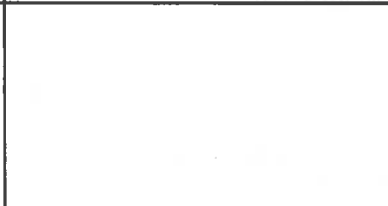

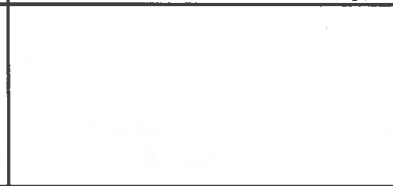
