FROM OUR PASTOR, FATHER AMATO

This week, to continue the discussion on Sacred Music, I want to delve a bit deeper into what the Second Vatican Council taught on music, as I alluded to last week when I quoted the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal*. The pope promulgated sixteen documents from the Second Vatican Council. Four of those documents are labelled as "Constitutions." These are the documents of the weightiest authority and deal with matters at the heart of what we believe, how we act, and how we worship. The very first document to be promulgated was *Sacrosanctum Concilium*, the Dogmatic Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, in 1963. From there, the reform of the liturgy and of the other rites went forward.

Here are some of the relevant sections of *Sacrosanctum Concilium* regarding Sacred Music:

"36. 1. Particular law remaining in force, the use of the Latin language is to be preserved in the Latin rites.

2. But since the use of the mother tongue, whether in the Mass, the administration of the sacraments, or other parts of the liturgy, frequently may be of great advantage to the people, the limits of its employment may be extended. This will apply in the first place to the readings and directives, and to some of the prayers and chants, according to the regulations on this matter to be laid down separately in subsequent chapters."

"54. In Masses which are celebrated with the people, a suitable place may be allotted to their mother tongue. This is to apply in the first place to the readings and 'the common prayer,' but also, as local conditions may warrant, to those parts which pertain to the people, according to the norm laid down in Art. 36 of this Constitution.

Nevertheless steps should be taken so that the faithful may also be able to say or to sing together in Latin those parts of the Ordinary of the Mass which pertain to them."

"116. The Church acknowledges Gregorian chant as specially suited to the Roman liturgy: therefore, other things being equal, it should be given pride of place in liturgical services. But other kinds of sacred music, especially polyphony, are by no means excluded from liturgical celebrations, so long as they accord with the spirit of the liturgical action, as laid down in Art. 30."

I want to highlight a few interesting points. First, for us Roman Catholics, our liturgical language has been Latin for more than 1500 years, at least. The Church still recognizes this, but allows us to worship in our own, vernacular language. Vatican II was far more restrictive in the use of the vernacular language than what actually came about in the years after that council to the present day. Nevertheless, the council saw the importance of all the people being able to at least recite or sing the Ordinary of the Mass (The *Gloria*, *Creed*, *Sanctus*, and *Lamb of God*). I would bet many people probably already know at least the *Sanctus* and *Agnus Dei* if they were to hear it.

And that relates to the second thing I wanted to highlight, and that is the use of Gregorian chant. Many people were probably told, or at least believed, that Gregorian chant was somehow banned after Vatican II. It was certainly abandoned in the years that followed, but in fact, the council says quite clearly that Gregorian chant "should be given pride of place." Typically at our Mass here, you will hear some Gregorian chant for the Entrance Antiphon, Psalm, and sometimes the Offertory and Communion verses. Briefly, it is most fitting for the Roman liturgy because of the solemnity and reverence "built-in" to it. The various tones that are used or the melody that is developed is based on the text (usually Scriptural, in the case of the Mass) which helps us enter more deeply into the liturgical action. Gregorian chant forms us to better appreciate what is happening in the sanctuary, and to participate in that action in the way proper to each of us. In recent years, there has been a lot of work done to set English Psalms and other texts to the Gregorian tones which has opened a new world of music for a lot of people.

Next week, I will show from the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* what we are expected to sing and what those sources of Sacred Music should be for us at the Mass.

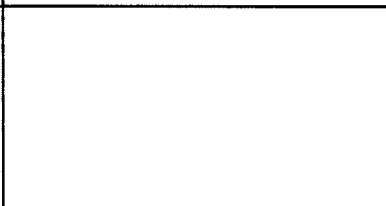

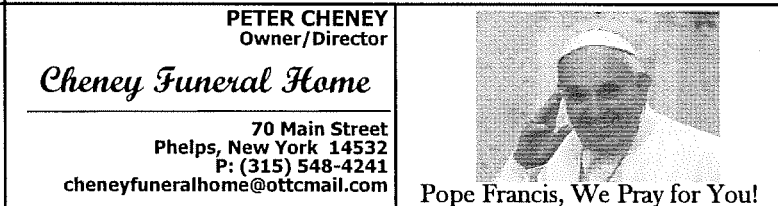
