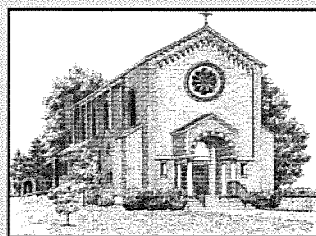


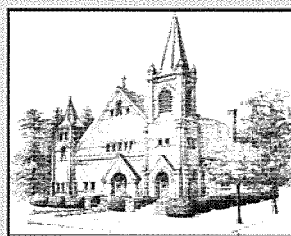

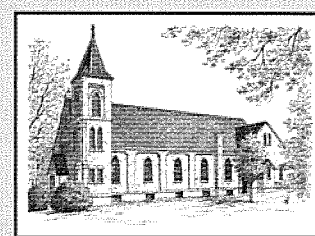

ST. PETER'S ROMAN CATHOLIC PARISH at the CHURCHES of ST. DOMINIC, ST. FELIX, and ST. FRANCIS

FROM OUR PASTOR, FATHER AMATO

We now complete the three great successive feast days, as we prepare to enter into summer. The Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Our Lord Jesus Christ (*Corpus Christi*) focuses our attention on the reality of the Real Presence of God in our midst, Who has come to us as our food and to live with us and within us. This feast day used to be celebrated on the Thursday following Holy Trinity Sunday, but with the option to transfer it to Sunday as an "external solemnity." Prior to the current Mass, it was just celebrated as *Corpus Christi*, the Body of Christ. The feast of the Blood of Christ was celebrated on July 1, with the whole month dedicated to the Precious Blood. Now we have them combined into one day.

It is this very Presence of Christ from which all peace flows to us. This is the first thing to know when we are thinking about the purpose of the Sign of Peace at Mass, for example. First, here is the prayer that I pray just before offering Peace to the people: "Lord Jesus Christ, who said to your Apostles: Peace I leave you, my peace I give you, look not on our sins, but on the faith of your Church, and graciously grant her peace and unity in accordance with your will. Who live and reign for ever and ever."

That is one of the few prayers in the Mass spoken directly to Christ who at that point is present on the altar in the Holy Eucharist. In the older form of the Mass, the priest would kiss the altar any time he addressed the people, "The Lord be with you." This is because the altar represents Christ and all peace flows from Him. In the Solemn Mass, the priest and deacon would kiss the altar, the priest gives the Sign of Peace to the deacon, then the deacon gives it to the subdeacon and down through the ranks in a hierarchical way. There are a lot of historical details in the development of the liturgy throughout the centuries, but one thing that was done was that the laity would kiss a picture of Christ (like an icon), symbolizing the sharing of peace and communion which are the preconditions for receiving Holy Communion worthily.

As you are aware, the Sign of Peace was done regularly in the current form of the Mass for forty or fifty years or so. This was then suspended as Covid spread a couple years ago. Because it was done so regularly and universally, there was the impression that the Sign of Peace was a mandatory part of the Mass. As it turns out, it was always optional, as the rubric says at that point in the Mass: "Then, if appropriate, the deacon, or the Priest, adds...". In the current Mass, it was always left to the discretion of the priest celebrant whether to include time for people to express the Sign of Peace to each other.

The priest has many options to choose from in almost all parts of the Mass, and I have found throughout my entire life, that the Sign of Peace is often an occasion where people socialize and converse, which can be a major distraction from the essence of what is happening at that moment in the Mass. From my experience, the "Lamb of God" then can become like an interlude which settles people down so that they can refocus on the liturgical action. There is plenty of time to greet one another and "catch up" after Mass. The "Lamb of God" should be recited/sung by all, as everyone currently does.

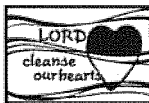
I think there is a range of appropriate individual piety and devotion that can be expressed during the Mass. Some people offer the Sign of Peace anyways to their immediate family without being prompted. That is perfectly acceptable. Others might just be praying intently and find it distracting to have a certain social pressure placed on them to converse/speak to others while our Lord is present on the altar. I understand both of those approaches.

The peace for which we truly long can neither be given by this world, nor taken away. It comes from Heaven and is given to us as our food in the Most Holy Eucharist. It is this interior peace that allows for us to live in peace with our neighbor in mutual friendship and love. I conclude with St. Theresa of Avila: "Let nothing trouble thee – nothing frighten thee – all things pass away – God is immutable – patience obtains all – he that possesses God, can want for nothing – God alone suffices."

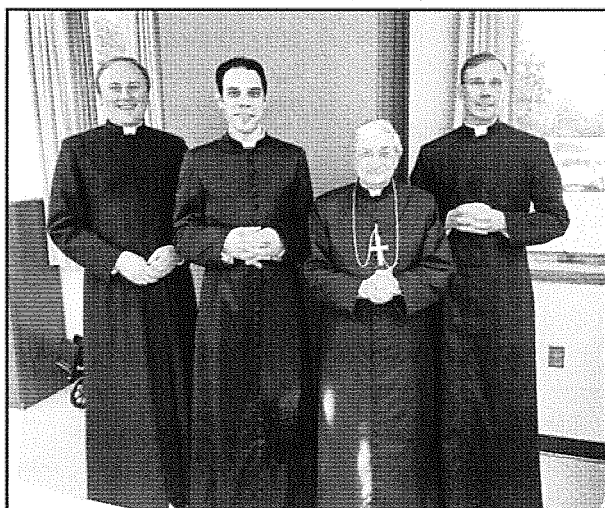


