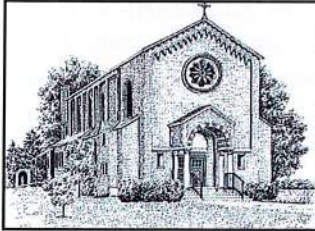

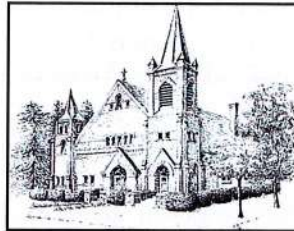

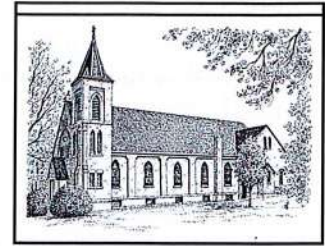

FROM OUR PASTOR, FATHER AMATO

This week, on February 2, we celebrate the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, formerly called the Feast of the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary. But even when this day was celebrated as the Purification, it was still considered a Feast of the Lord, and not a feast of the Blessed Virgin Mary. What's going on here?

Well, as I often say when preaching about Mary: where Christ is, there is Mary; wherever Mary is, there is Christ. This is one of the oldest feast days in the Church celebrating the Blessed Virgin Mary. While we are officially in the liturgical season of Ordinary Time, this feast day traditionally concludes the Season of Christmas. From the announcement of the angels to the shepherds of the birth of Christ, to the visit of the Magi on Epiphany, to hearing about Our Lord's Baptism and first miracles and preaching, to this moment where Mary carried her divine Son into the Temple to be dedicated to God, we have seen the various ways in which Jesus shows us His true identity as Son of God.

It has been forty days since Christmas and the Mosaic Law requires that a woman who had given birth to a son could not approach the Tabernacle for forty days. At that time, a sacrifice would be offered for her purification. The Gospel for the day tells us that the offering was to be "a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons." We may then ask, "Why would Mary need 'purification' at all, especially after giving birth to the Son of God? Why would Jesus need to be dedicated to God when He is God?" These are good questions.

The traditional answer to these questions is that we are given the example of the necessity of perfect obedience to the will of God. Though Mary had no need of purification, she submits to God's will in all things. Her Son, Jesus, God Incarnate, became like us in all things and voluntarily submitted to His own Law, as He did in His circumcision, and as He would be obedient even unto death on the Cross. Dom Prosper Guéranger, O.S.B. tell us that: "And yet the Holy Spirit revealed to Mary that she must comply with both these laws. She, the holy Mother of God, must go to the Temple like other Hebrew mothers, as though she had lost something which needed restoring by a legal sacrifice. He that is the Son of God and Son of Man must be treated in all things as though he were a servant, and be ransomed in common with the poorest Jewish boy. Mary adores the will of God and embraces it with her whole heart."

The scene that is given to us is that we see Mary entering God's Temple while holding God Himself in her arms. He is coming into His own house, to give light and peace to the aged Simeon who finally is able to see his salvation with his own eyes. Mary has become the tabernacle who housed God in her womb, and who now carries her God into His own Temple. This is the background for one of the unique features of our liturgical year: the blessing of candles before Mass. We also call this feast day "Candlemas" for this reason.

As the candles are blessed, we process into the church with those lights burning before us. At that time, we are reminded of the Light of the World entering into the Temple on this day. We can also recall the flame of faith that was first given to us at our baptism, entrusted to our parents and godparents at that time to be kept burning brightly. This is precisely what we are reminded of at the Easter Vigil as well. People are invited to bring candles that will then be blessed at the beginning of Mass.

Finally, the candle itself carries its own symbolism. St. Anselm of Canterbury tells us that the wax, which is the production of the virginal bee, is the Flesh of our Lord; the wick, which is within, is his Soul; the flame, which burns on the top, is his Divinity. Christ is the light who enlightens our darkness from within. We rejoice that He has chosen us to enter His Temple with Him!
