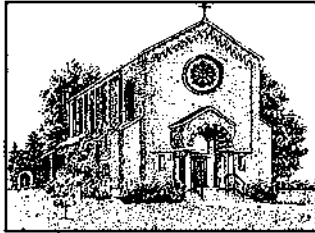

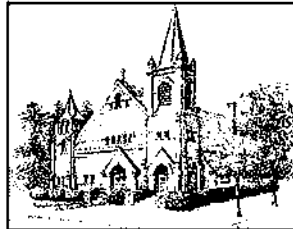

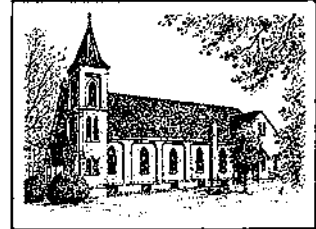

FROM OUR PASTOR, FATHER AMATO

The readings for the past couple weeks have focused our minds on the Last Things. As we make our approach to the end of the liturgical year next week, our thoughts will be more drawn to the end of time, whether that is the end of the world, when our Lord returns in glory, or the end of our own lives. In either case, the Church prepares us to meet the Risen Lord.

This encounter with the Risen Lord happens at every Mass. The study of the "Last Things" or things pertaining to "The End" (of time and of history) is called "Eschatology," from the Greek word *eschaton*, meaning simply "the end." This is important because every Mass has an "eschatological dimension," meaning that while we encounter the Risen Lord, we yet await His return as we journey to meet Him.

In the Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy from the Second Vatican Council, §8, we read: "In the earthly liturgy we take part in a foretaste of that heavenly liturgy which is celebrated in the holy city of Jerusalem *toward which we journey as pilgrims*, where Christ is sitting at the right hand of God, a minister of the holies and of the true tabernacle; we sing a hymn to the Lord's glory with all the warriors of the heavenly army; venerating the memory of the saints, we hope for some part and fellowship with them; we eagerly await the Savior, Our Lord Jesus Christ, until He, our life, shall appear and we too will appear with Him in glory" [emphasis added].

The liturgy must always have this "eschatological" dimension. This is why we have a crucifix on the altar that the priest faces during the Mass. While the priest is facing one direction and the people are facing another, it is not the case that he is "facing the people" in the sense that he is addressing them while praying the Eucharistic Prayer. He is facing the Lord. He is leading his people to the heavenly Jerusalem "towards which we journey as pilgrims." I wrote several articles last year explaining each prayer of the Roman Canon (Eucharistic Prayer I) and how prayer, in general, is addressed to the Father, through the Son, and in the Holy Spirit.

In the first part of the Mass, prior to the Offertory, the priest does generally face the people. He addresses them directly. The pulpit faces towards the people so that the Word can be proclaimed to them, and the homily is preached to them. But the Eucharistic Prayer is different. At that moment, after hearing the Word and contemplating it, we turn together towards the Lord to offer the Eucharistic Sacrifice.

This is why I am often either looking directly down at the Host on the altar, or looking up to heaven, at various parts of the Eucharistic Prayer. It may seem like I am ignoring the people in front of me, but that is certainly not the case. I am simply addressing the Lord directly (on behalf of and with the people), but I understand how the direction the priest faces at the altar can give the impression that he is supposed to be speaking to the people. With this in mind, we can also see how with the priest facing the other direction, that is, when he is facing the *same direction as the people*, he is not "turning his back to them," but he is simply expressing, through his posture, what is being expressed by the Eucharistic Prayer and the reality of the what is occurring in the Liturgy.

I will have more on this topic next week. As we make our final preparations for Advent, and the celebration of Christ the King next week, let us prepare our minds and hearts to welcome the King of Kings and to be ready to go out to meet Him when he comes.
