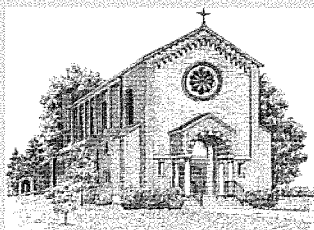


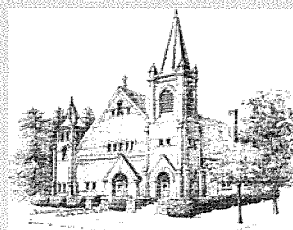

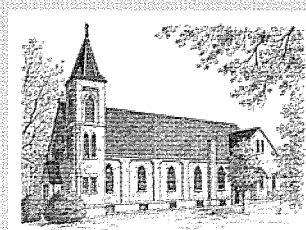

FROM OUR PASTOR, FATHER AMATO

"I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst."

My dear friends, this week we continue our reflection upon John 6 and Our Lord concludes with the beautiful words given above. Throughout the Gospel of John, we hear Jesus seven times making these "I am" statements, revealing His identity: "I am the Bread of Life..." (John 6:35); "I am the Light of the world..." (John 8:12); "I am the Resurrection and the Life..." (John 11:25); etc.... Even in the section of this chapter which we did not read, when Jesus comes to His disciples on the water, He simply responds to them, "It is I. Do not be afraid" (John 6:20). At Jesus' arrest in the Garden (John 18:5-6) we read: "They answered him, 'Jesus the Nazorean.' He said to them, 'I AM.' Judas his betrayer was also with them. When he said to them, 'I AM,' they turned away and fell to the ground."

Why would these guards who came to arrest Him turn away and fall to the ground? What is the relationship with all these *I Am* statements? Simply put, this is how God identifies Himself. When we look back at Exodus 3:14, when God spoke to Moses from the burning bush, Moses asks God to give him His name so he can tell Pharaoh who sent him. God says His name is "I AM," or "I am the one who is." The significance here is that Jesus is identifying Himself as the one who spoke to Moses through the burning bush. He is the Eternal God. This is why He was on trial for "blasphemy."

And now, in John 6, the first "I am" statement in the Gospel, He is saying that He is truly the Bread that will satisfy your soul such that you will never hunger and never thirst again. As we go on in this chapter, He is even more explicit regarding how we must consume this Bread, His Flesh, if we are to have eternal life.

This is why, in whatever parish I am in, I strongly promote Eucharistic Adoration. The monstrance from which Our Lord radiantly shows us His Eucharistic Face is like the burning bush: on fire with the presence of God, but not consumed by the flames. When we come to Adoration, we are in the presence of the "I AM," the one who multiplied the loaves in John 6 and spoke of Himself as the Bread of Life.

Over the course of the next month, I will try to finalize a new schedule of Eucharistic Adoration and Confessions, ensuring that each church in our parish has time for Adoration during the day, concluding with Confessions during the final hour and Benediction at about 6:00pm. This will require a commitment to always having one or two people in the church while Our Lord is exposed. I am sure that will not be a problem given what I have already seen of your great devotion to Our Eucharistic King.

Let us pray that we always keep Our Lord, the Bread of Life, as the center of our minds and hearts.

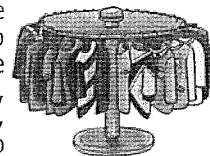
AN HOUR DURING ADORATION FOR PRO-LIFE ISSUES

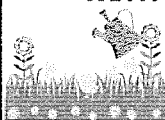
SAVE THE DATE for AARON KELLY's ORDINATION

PRAY FOR VOCATIONS WITH MOTHERS OF LU!

The Mothers of Lu is the remarkable vocations story of mothers from the small Italian village of Lu, who, in 1881, met weekly to pray not only for vocations to the priesthood and religious life, but prayed in a particular way for these vocations to come from their own families. The story witnesses, *"Through the trusting prayer of these mothers and openness of the other parents, an atmosphere of deep joy and Christian piety developed in the families, making it much easier for the children to recognize their vocations."*

323 vocations was the astonishing fruit of the Lu mothers' prayers: **152 priests** and **171 nuns!**

A 21st Century Mothers of Lu Prayer group was formed in the Diocese of Rochester to pray with the same specific intention of calling priests and religious from our own families. The group pledges to:

- meet at 7pm on the first Tuesday of the month at Sacred Heart Cathedral to pray for this intention in Adoration of the Most Blessed Sacrament (this Tuesday—**Aug. 3rd**);
- pray weekly the Lu Vocations Prayer with either Rosary/Adoration;
- and receive the Holy Eucharist on the first Sunday of the month for this intention.

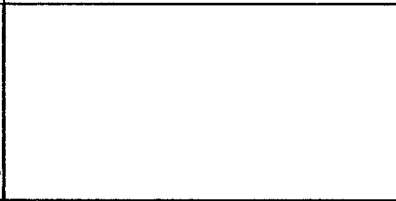

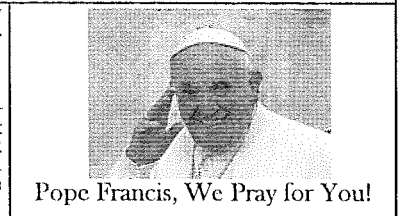
