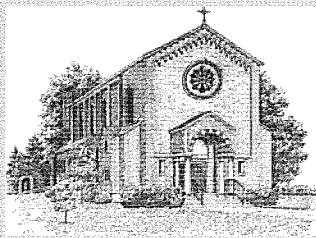


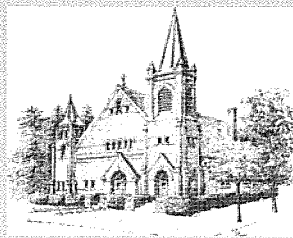

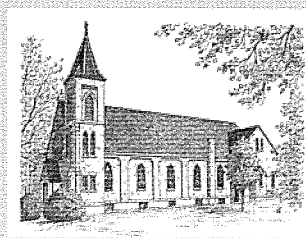

FROM OUR PASTOR, FATHER AMATO

I wanted to take this opportunity, in a two-part series, to teach about the Assumption of Mary as we celebrate this glorious feast in honor of the Mother of God being taken body and soul into heavenly glory.

Of course, two bulletin articles is still nowhere near enough to praise Mary and her privilege of her assumption into heaven, but I wanted at least to, first, give you a brief record of the tradition on this teaching, and then next week to give you the reasons for this teaching as it is so connected with our other beliefs.

On November 1, 1950, Pope Pius XII, in his Apostolic Constitution *Munificentissimus Deus* ("The most bountiful God"), declared the fact "that the Immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory" to be a divinely revealed dogma (§44). But this belief did not come out of nowhere. Throughout the document, the pope constantly attests to the *antiquity and consistency* of this belief from the earliest days of the Church to our very own day.

This is crucial for understanding the Pope's role (and the bishops in communion with him) in teaching on matter of faith and morals. They cannot simply propose new things for our belief as matters of faith. And they cannot deny what has already been declared to be divinely revealed. Their role is to guard, teach, and protect the truths of the Faith that have been handed on to us. Up until 1950, the dogma of the Assumption of Mary was not formally declared as a dogma, and so Pius XII wanted to show on what basis he makes an infallible judgment that it is in fact a divinely revealed truth and that Christians have held it as such.

First, Pius XII points to the testimony of the faithful down through the ages who know that Mary had died, yet "this in no way prevented them from believing and from professing openly that her sacred body had never been subject to the corruption of the tomb, and that the august tabernacle of the Divine Word had never been reduced to dust and ashes" (§14).

Second, he points to "the innumerable temples which have been dedicated to the Virgin Mary assumed into heaven" (§15), as well as cities, dioceses, and regions dedicated under the patronage of Mary assumed into heaven. Third, the liturgy itself, in both the West and the East, attest to this belief. This is also important because it is not just a belief in a particular region of the world, in one culture and language. It has been a universal belief. The fact that many liturgical rites (of increasing solemnity over the centuries) express this belief reminds us that, because the liturgy is subject to the supreme authority of the Church, we can learn what the Church teaches by how She prays (§16).

Finally, from the earliest days of the Church, Christians have venerated the relics of saints. At no time in the history of the Church has the Church claimed to have the relics of the body of Mary, and no one has searched for them (§33). This is astonishing given early Marian devotion and the early Christians' devotion to the bodily relics of the saints.

In the next article, I will briefly give the theological reasons for our faith in the Assumption of Mary.

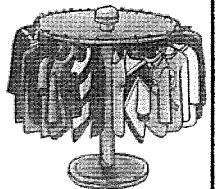
RED CROSS BLOOD DRIVE

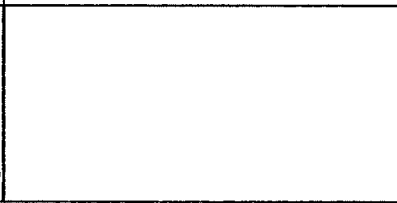
