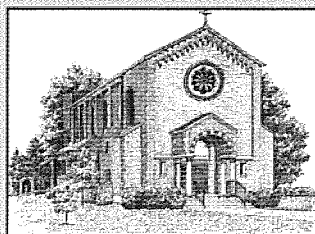


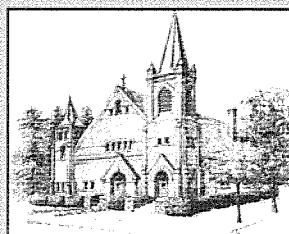

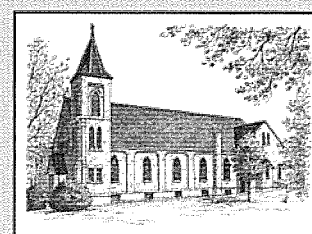

ST. PETER'S ROMAN CATHOLIC PARISH at the CHURCHES of ST. DOMINIC, ST. FELIX, and ST. FRANCIS

FROM OUR PASTOR, FATHER AMATO

Last week I briefly outlined the relationship between sin and punishment, and how God's justice must be satisfied, even after the remission of the guilt of our sins, if we are to enter into heavenly glory. Now, it is important to understand the "Communion of Saints," the "treasury of the Church," and the doctrine of indulgences.

Pope Paul VI reminds us that "there reigns among men, by the hidden and benign mystery of the divine will, a supernatural solidarity whereby the sin of one harms the others just as the holiness of one also benefits the others" (*Indulgentiarum doctrina*, 4). We know this almost intuitively without needing any great learning or study. But we know this in a more profound way by divine revelation. The Apostle Paul is clear: "For if, by the transgression of one person, death came to reign through that one, how much more will those who receive the abundance of grace and of the gift of justification come to reign in life through the one person Jesus Christ. In conclusion, just as through one transgression condemnation came upon all, so through one righteous act acquittal and life came to all" (Romans 5:17-18). So, we are bound together, first through the sin of Adam, but now through the Cross of Christ.

It has always been part of the Christian life that members of the Church would pray for each other, sacrifice for one another, and perform penitential acts for expiation of sins for themselves and others. By this exchange of spiritual goods, the faithful become more immersed in charity as they strive to imitate Christ and seek to participate in the salvation of their brethren. Within the Mystical Body of Christ, our lives are bound to one another, and this we call the "Communion of Saints" (*ID*, 5).

With this in mind, we understand the "treasury of the Church" then to be "the infinite and inexhaustible value the expiation and the merits of Christ Our Lord have before God, offered as they were so that all of mankind could be set free from sin and attain communion with the Father. It is Christ the Redeemer himself in whom the satisfactions and merits of his redemption exist and find their force" (*ID*, 5). This "treasury" also includes the merits of all the saints, especially those of the Blessed Virgin Mary, who now reign in heaven with Christ, and whose bond with us is strengthened by the fact that they are now forever united to Christ in glory.

As the Church is not just a Mystical Body, but also truly a visible Body, governed by the Pope (and the bishops in communion with him), the Lord gave this authority to Peter, the Apostles, and their successors. Part of this authority to govern, teach, and sanctify, is to dispense the treasury of merits for the benefit of individual faithful. Therefore, an "indulgence" is: "the remission before God of the temporal punishment due sins already forgiven as far as their guilt is concerned, which the follower of Christ with the proper dispositions and under certain determined conditions acquires through the intervention of the Church which, as minister of the Redemption, authoritatively dispenses and applies the treasury of the satisfaction won by Christ and the saints" (*ID*, n. 1).

There are *partial* and *plenary* indulgences. Partial indulgences remit some of the punishments due to sin while plenary indulgences remit all punishments. In order to earn a *plenary* indulgence, one must perform the particular work to which the indulgence is attached (for example, the five decades of the Rosary), sacramental confession (within 20 days before or after the work), receive Holy Communion, and pray for the intentions of the Supreme Pontiff (typically one Our Father, One Hail Mary, and one Glory Be). It is further required that all attachment to sin, even to venial sin, be absent.

On All Souls Day (November 2), you can gain a plenary indulgence for all the souls in Purgatory if you visit a church, pray for those souls, and say the Our Father and the Apostles Creed. All other conditions above must also be met.

From November 1-8, you can earn a plenary indulgence for all the souls in Purgatory by visiting a cemetery and praying, even only mentally, for the faithful departed, with all the other conditions met.




