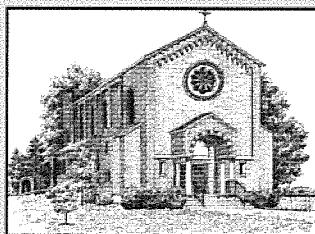
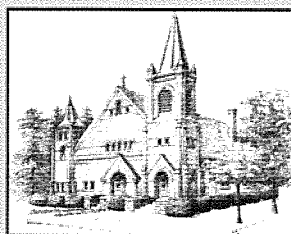


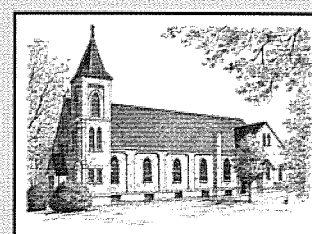

**ST. PETER'S ROMAN CATHOLIC PARISH at the CHURCHES of ST. DOMINIC, ST. FELIX, and ST. FRANCIS
FROM OUR PASTOR, FATHER AMATO**

This Saturday we celebrate the *Solemnity of Saint Joseph, Husband of the Blessed Virgin Mary*. I was in attendance at last year's celebration, serving the Latin Mass and hearing confessions, and witnessed the large Consecration to St. Joseph take place. At that time, I honestly did not think I would be so fortunate as to be the priest at this parish (and certainly not the very next year!). However, it was only five days later that I found out I would be here at the end of June (but, of course, I had to keep it secret until the proper time). This year, we are fortunate to celebrate this solemnity on a Saturday.

As I have been advertising, we are having a traditional St. Joseph's Table ("la tavala di San Giuseppe") celebration on this coming Saturday evening after Mass. So, I wanted to take this time to explain the tradition of the St. Joseph's Table and why we celebrate it.

There are plenty of times throughout the history of Europe where great devotions and festivals were established after God, sometimes through the intercession of the saints, ended a plague or averted a natural disaster. St. Joseph's Day is no different. When a terrible famine afflicted the people of Sicily, they prayed to St. Joseph for their protection and that rain would come so they would not starve. St. Joseph responded, rain came, and the people rejoiced.

Of course, a thanksgiving to God for His goodness was due, and so the people began to celebrate by offering back to God the gifts he had given them through the intercession of St. Joseph. Traditionally, the food offered at the celebration contains no meat, and a lot of bread, including various pastas and beans, as well. The lack of meat is simply due to the fact that the feast always occurs during Lent, a penitential season.

The items placed on the "altar" or "table" shrine to St. Joseph represent the things we eat for our sustenance, offered to God in thanksgiving, but also various symbolic items that refer to the life of St. Joseph (tools, bread in various symbolic shapes, votive candles offering our prayers to the saint, etc.). The other Mediterranean items, such as olives, citrus fruit, and wine, connect this celebration to its origins in the devotion of the Sicilian people, and from there, throughout Italy, Europe, and to the rest of the world, wherever they settled once they left their homeland.

The altar typically has three steps, symbolizing the ascent to heaven. The statue of St. Joseph is at the top, reminding us of his protection and intercession from heaven. We also keep in mind this day the needs of the poor. It is a tradition that no one is to be turned away from partaking in the celebration. God gave us the great things we have: the Church, our Faith, food, family, and fellowship. These are for all people, whatever their means.

I pray your Lenten observances are going well. This Saturday, let us take the time to celebrate together the Patron of the Universal Church, glorious St. Joseph.

REMEMBER TO KEEP THESE LENTEN REGULATIONS

Traditionally, the Lenten season is a time of penance, prayer, the reception of the sacraments, charity and almsgiving. The following are various Lenten regulations:

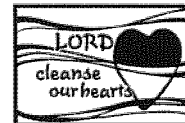
Good Friday—along with Ash Wednesday, this is a day of **Fast & Abstinence from meat**. Everyone between the ages of 18 & 59 inclusive are limited to one full meal on this day.

All Fridays of Lent—Fridays of Lent are days of **Abstinence from Meat**. All those 14 & up are bound to *abstain* from meat.

Other Weekdays of Lent—There is no obligation to fast. However, voluntary acts of self-denial and more prayer, and almsgiving, are forms of penance.




