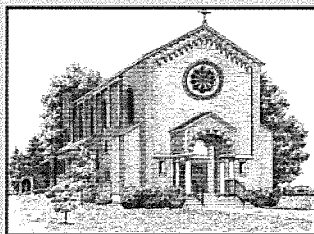
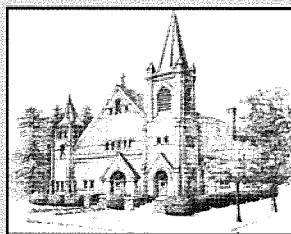


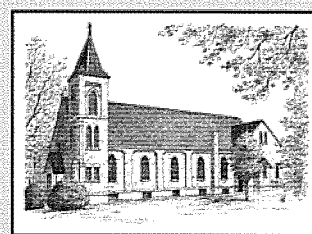

ST. PETER'S ROMAN CATHOLIC PARISH at the CHURCHES of ST. DOMINIC, ST. FELIX, and ST. FRANCIS

FROM OUR PASTOR, FATHER AMATO

This week I wanted to give a bit of history behind the prayers we say after Mass, before the closing hymn or postlude. Whether we pray the three *Hail Marys* and the *St. Michael Prayer* or just the *St. Michael Prayer* there is a tradition there based on a slightly longer set of prayers given to us by Pope Leo XIII.

Some people may think these prayers are the Church's response to Our Lady of Fatima's request to pray for the conversion of Russia to the Catholic Faith, lest the errors of Russia spread throughout the world. This message was given on July 13, 1917. In part, the message from Mary reads: "If my requests are heeded, Russia will be converted, and there will be peace; if not, she will spread her errors throughout the world, causing wars and persecutions of the Church. The good will be martyred, the Holy Father will have much to suffer, various nations will be annihilated. In the end, my Immaculate Heart will triumph. The Holy Father will consecrate Russia to me, and she will be converted, and a period of peace will be granted to the world." All these years later, the message is still relevant.

I will get back to that in a moment. You can find much information on the internet as to whether previous popes have consecrated Russia "correctly." That is not something I will deal with here. For now, we must note that the prayers that are said at the end of Mass have their origins in the difficult and complicated political situation in 19th century Italy. In the 1830s, secret societies, such as Masonry and the Carbonari, stirred up rebellions in the Papal States. In the 1850s, the governments around the Papal States all fell to these ideologies. Surrounded, Pope Pius IX ordered certain public prayers to be said throughout the Papal States: three *Hail Marys*, the *Hail, Holy Queen*, a versicle and a Collect. Rome was taken over by the revolutionaries, led by Giuseppe Garibaldi, in 1870, and the Pope's land was reduced to the Vatican.

The trouble continued for Pope Leo XIII throughout the 1880s. The government enacted laws against the Catholic clergy and had confiscated the goods of Catholic charitable associations. On January 6, 1884, Leo XIII declared that the same prayers that Pius IX ordered to be prayed would now be prayed after every Low Mass (Mass with no singing) throughout the world "so that the Christian people would implore God with common prayer for that very thing which benefits the whole Christian commonwealth."

By 1886, we have the prayers as they were prayed until 1962. There were three *Hail Marys*, followed by *Hail, Holy Queen*, a versicle, a Collect, and the *St. Michael Prayer*. The Collect was said as follows: "O God, our refuge and our strength, look down in mercy on Thy people who cry to Thee; and by the intercession of the glorious and Immaculate Virgin Mary, Mother of God, of St. Joseph her Spouse, of Thy blessed Apostles Peter and Paul, and of all the Saints, in mercy and goodness hear our prayers for the conversion of sinners, and for the liberty and exaltation of our holy Mother the Church. Through the same Christ our Lord. Amen."

Those "Leonine Prayers" were answered by God. On June 9, 1929, Pope Pius XI signed a treaty with the King of Italy which regulated relations between the Italian government and the Holy See. However, by this time, the Communist government in Russia had begun persecuting Catholics. Pius XI called for the "Leonine Prayers" to be offered now for the intention that Christ "permit tranquility and freedom to profess the faith to be restored to the afflicted people of Russia." These prayers were answered on October 1, 1990, when the Soviet Union allowed freedom of religion.

I give this brief history for a few reasons. First, *God hears our prayers*. We do not know how or when He will answer them, but He answers them. Second, these are good prayers to pray for whatever intention we may have (even in the abbreviated form we use), whether as a thanksgiving after Mass, or even for the conversion of Russia, as our Lady of Fatima had requested. Finally, *Pope Francis will consecrate Russia to the Immaculate Heart of Mary, this Friday, March 25, the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord*. Pray for the freedom of the Church throughout the world. Pray for peace. Pray for the triumph of the Immaculate Heart of Mary.

REMEMBER TO KEEP THESE LENTEN REGULATIONS

Traditionally, the Lenten season is a time of penance, prayer, the reception of the sacraments, charity and almsgiving. The following are various Lenten regulations:

Good Friday—along with Ash Wednesday, this is a day of **Fast & Abstinence from meat**. Everyone between the ages of 18 & 59 inclusive are limited to one full meal on this day.

All Fridays of Lent—Fridays of Lent are days of **Abstinence from Meat**. All those 14 & up are bound to *abstain* from meat.

Other Weekdays of Lent—There is no obligation to fast. However, voluntary acts of self-denial and more prayer, and almsgiving, are forms of penance.




