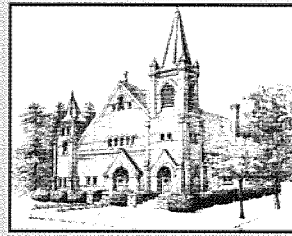


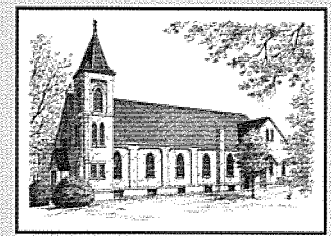

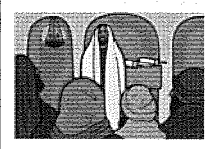

**ST. PETER'S ROMAN CATHOLIC PARISH at the CHURCHES of ST. DOMINIC, ST. FELIX, and ST. FRANCIS
FROM OUR PASTOR, FATHER AMATO**

Last week, for the beginning of my homily, I spoke about the March for Life – which took place on Friday, January 21, in Washington, DC – and my experience there, and what I had witnessed. At the time I write this, there is still no official count of the number of people there, but the crowd was impressively large, possibly in the hundreds of thousands. Time-lapse videos show constant streams of people as they walk down Constitution Avenue, passing the Capitol, to the steps of the Supreme Court.

Yet, it is not the size of the crowd that matters so much. It is the very fact that we are standing for what is right, good and true that matters. If there were only ten people there, it may have been discouraging, but it would not change the message or the value of the work that is being done to end abortion in our country. However, it was edifying to see the powerful witness of so many people from around the country: young people, priest and seminarians, and others from all walks of life. The joy that was present there was infectious, as I could hear chants and songs of all sorts coming from every direction. Besides all of the pro-life slogans, I could hear various hymns in honor of Mary, the praises of God sung all around me, and we had the confidence to keep marching, knowing that we are not alone in this endeavor.

It was cold. In such conditions we are forced to ask ourselves why we are doing this. Can we not accomplish the same thing by sitting at home, warm, and away from such large crowds? To an extent, we can. But after such a long time of our churches being closed to public worship in 2020, we should be all the more aware now of the value of being together, physically present with one another, for a common purpose – whether that is the worship of God or witnessing to the pro-life cause. All the inconveniences of travel, the suffering we endured from lack of sleep, from the cold, and whatever else, were offered so that not only abortion would end, but that God's love would be so evident in our world through those who profess faith in Him that such an action as abortion would be unthinkable. This was my prayer.

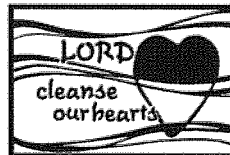
Such bitter cold was countered by the warmth of God's love. I saw there the Body of Christ at its best. I wondered what the world would be like if every place where Christians gathered there would be the same love, joy, peace, and care for one another. This is the hope that brings people back year after year to the March for Life. Yet, each year, we hope it is the last one we ever have to do. But even if abortion is outlawed, that is only the beginning of the work set before us. It is on each of us to help build a *culture* of life and of love where every person comes to know the love and care God has for them, a culture that knows that every child is accepted and loved, and every mother (and father) have the support they need from those who follow Christ.

Next year, January 20, 2023, is the 50th March for Life in Washington, DC. We continue to march and to work for a world that has true justice for all; a world where the love, mercy, and compassion of Christ reigns.
