

FROM OUR PASTOR, FATHER AMATO

We have to make many decisions in life and throughout each day and, naturally, we want to do what is best. We want to do God's will. However, we do not always have perfect clarity in the decisions we have to make. I know this when it comes to choosing a vocation, or various matters for the parish. We sometimes expect a voice from the sky or some "sign" to tell us what to do. Sometimes God does in fact give us signs, but most often we have to put the pieces together from what is before us and the best counsel that we can gather.

After doing our due diligence, we have to make a decision. Lack of certitude may really bother us, but sometimes we can have the tendency to want to be released from the burden of making a decision and being responsible for it. A stance that will bring greater peace and consolation is to make the best decision we can, without allowing the various possibilities to paralyze us, and then abandon ourselves to our loving God, who knows that we are doing our best. This stance comes from a place where we know that our Father is not "out to get us," waiting for us to make a mistake so that He may punish us, but rather, even if we make a mistake, despite our best efforts, God may draw good even from that error and we have an opportunity to grow in humility (Searching for and Maintaining Peace, 73-74).

Fr. Philippe goes on to give us a second aspect to our problem with incertitude:

"For another thing, we would love to be infallible, to never be wrong, but there is a lot of pride in this desire and there is also the fear of being judged by others. The one, on the contrary, who accepts peacefully the idea of being wrong from time to time and accepts that others know it manifests true humility and a true love of God" (p. 74).

Imagine if we never make a mistake, even a mistake that comes after serious deliberation – let alone ones that we make out of an emotional reaction – and think how we would approach God. Perhaps a better way to put it is that we could imagine if we never *realized* we made a mistake. We would never have occasion to grow in humility or to seek pardon from God. We especially would not realize the need to be rid of the self-reliance of pride and to cling to Christ and His Cross.

Of course, this is not license to sin, but the realization that we are wounded and that any true healing comes from the Divine Physician. We are, in fact, called to perfection: "So be perfect, just as your heavenly Father is perfect" (Matthew 5:48). However, perfectionism is not the same as the perfect love to which God calls us. Perfectionism is an attitude that was somewhat related in last week's article. It pertains to having an image of ourselves that is never allowed to make a mistake, and the sadness and frustration that we feel at any sin comes from the pride of not living up to our own expectations rather than from offending God.

If the devil cannot get us to sin, especially gravely, then he will at least do all he can to bother us, to make us lose our peace. He will convince us that we are not doing enough, he will discourage us, and even make us think we must make sacrifices and achieve things that God is not calling us to do. The only response that brings peace is to cast ourselves into the arms of the Father as a small child would. It is this way of poverty that brings us peace because, as I wrote in a previous article, we know that we can do *nothing* without God.

"The behavior that is most perfect is not that which corresponds to the image that we sometimes form for ourselves of perfection, such as a comportment that is impeccable, infallible and spotless. Rather, it is one where there is the most disinterested love of God and the least prideful pursuit of oneself" (p. 79).

As we celebrate *Laetare* Sunday, with Passiontide and Holy Week right around the corner, I pray that the first half of Lent was fruitful and blessed for all of you.

LENTEN FAST & ABSTINENCE

Traditionally, the Lenten season is a time of penance, prayer, the reception of the sacraments, charity and almsgiving. The following are various Lenten regulations:

Good Friday-along with Ash Wednesday, this is a day of fast & abstinence from meat. Everyone between the ages of 18 & 59 inclusive are limited to one full meal on this day.

All Fridays of Lent-Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence from meat. All those 14 & up are bound to abstain from meat.

Other Weekdays of Lent—There is no obligation to fast. However, voluntary acts of self-denial are recommended (like giving up something difficult.)
